#### RULING ON PETITION TO INTERVENE FILED BY ROBERT SARVEY

Upon consideration of the Petition to Intervene (Petition) filed by Robert Sarvey (Petitioner)<sup>1</sup> in the Application for a Small Power Plant Exemption (SPPE) for the San Jose City Backup Generating Facility (Project),<sup>2</sup> the Presiding Member of the California Energy Commission (CEC)<sup>3</sup> committee designated to conduct proceedings in this matter (Committee)<sup>4</sup> makes the following findings:

- The Petition contains the information required by the CEC's regulations.<sup>5</sup>
- 3. The Petition states that Petitioner intends to participate in Public Health, Alternatives, Air Quality, Energy Resources, Hazardous Materials and GHG Emissions and to participate fully in the proceeding including submitting testimony and briefing, and cross-examination of the parties' witnesses.<sup>6</sup>
- 4. The Petition also states that if granted intervention, Petitioner would like to address recent attempts to limit public participation in commission proceedings.<sup>7</sup>
- 5. No opposition to the Petition has been filed, and the deadline for such opposition was November 10, 2021.
- 6. Petitioner's stated interests are relevant to the above-captioned proceeding.

**THEREFORE**, the Presiding Member hereby **GRANTS IN PART** the Petition and **ORDERS** that the Petitioner may participate on the following topic areas as requested by Petitioner:

- ALTERNATIVES
- AIR QUALITY
- ENERGY RESOURCES
- GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS
- PUBLIC HEALTH
- HAZARDS AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The Presiding Member hereby **DENIES IN PART** the Petition as it relates to Petitioner's request to "address recent attempts to limit public participation in commission proceedings." The Committee in this proceeding has not granted any request to limit public participation, and thus this is not an issue under adjudication in this proceeding. This order does not preclude Petitioner from submitting comments on this topic.

The Presiding Member further **ORDERS** that Petitioner's name be placed upon the Proof of Service List as an intervenor. Petitioner may exercise the rights and shall fulfill the obligations of a party as set forth in all orders issued in this matter and California

Code of Regulations, title 20, section 1212. Deadlines and other matters shall not be extended or changed by the granting of this Petition.<sup>8</sup>

The Petitioner's intervention is subject to further modification at the discretion of the Presiding Member or the Committee. Any limitations on Petitioner's participation in the capacity of intervenor do not affect Petitioner's ability to make public comments on other topics in the proceeding.

The CEC welcomes and values intervenor participation in its energy facility siting process. As an intervenor, Petitioner is required to file and serve documents on other parties and to follow the CEC's procedures and orders regarding presenting witnesses and evidence. Petitioner is further required to review the "General Orders Regarding Motions, Electronic Filing, Service of Documents, and Other Matters," the rules regarding filings, the rules of evidence that apply at the Evidentiary Hearings, and the rules prohibiting off-the-record contacts with commissioners, their advisors, or the hearing officer(s) about the Project. Petitioner's failure to fulfill these responsibilities may result in the Committee limiting or precluding Petitioner's participation in the proceedings.
