Perhaps the reference to time should be removed from 1621(c)(6) to read as shown below?

1621(c)(6) "Load management tariff" means a tariff with values that vary according to market conditions to encourage reductions in electricity use when supplies are insufficient and encourage use of greenhouse gas free electricity when supplies are underutilized.

Proposed regulatory language in the express terms for 1621(c)(6) is as shown below.

1621(c)(6) "Load management tariff" means a tariff with timedependent values that vary according to the time of day to encourage off-peak electricity use and reductions in peak electricity use.

Perhaps the reference to time should be removed from 1621(c)(7) to read as shown below?

1621(c)(7) "Marginal cost" or "locational marginal cost" means the change in cost that is caused by a change in market conditions at a specified location.

Proposed regulatory language in the express terms for 1621(c)(7) is as shown below.

1621(c)(7) "Marginal cost" or "locational marginal cost" means the change in current and future electric system cost that is caused by a change in electricity supply and demand during a specified time interval at a specified location.

The use of the above definitions to achieve the encouragement of the use of electrical energy at off-peak hours and encourage the control of daily and seasonal peak loads to improved electric system efficiency and reliability, lessen or delay the need for new electrical capacity, and reduce fossil fuel consumption and greenhouse gas emissions, thereby lowering the long-term economic and environmental costs of meeting the State's electricity needs are prescriptive standards.

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
