Overview of Geothermal Permitting Authority

California Energy Commission: Plants 50 megawatts (MW) and greater

Imperial County:

- Plants smaller than 50 MW
- Additions less than 50 MW to existing plants
- Plants from 50 MW – 100 MW with Small Power Plant Exemption
- Additions from 50 MW – 100 MW to existing plants with Small Power Plant Exemption
- All plants with Delegation of Geothermal Licensing



Overview of Geothermal Permitting Authority

- Geothermal wells – CalGem
- Lithium extraction related to geothermal plants – Requires further exploration





Details on CEC Processes

Projects 50 MW and Larger – Licensed by the CEC

- Certified regulatory program equivalent to CEQA Process
- Process:
 - AFC
 - Data Adequacy
 - Data Requests and Responses
 - Preliminary and Final Staff Assessments
 - Evidentiary Hearing
 - Commission Approval (Licensing) or Denial

- One-stop shop for environmental review and permitting (Section 25500 of Warren-Alquist Act)
- Laws, Ordinances, Regulations, and Standards (LORS)
- Environmental Justice
- Many opportunities for public and agency participation
- Hearings – Adjudicatory process

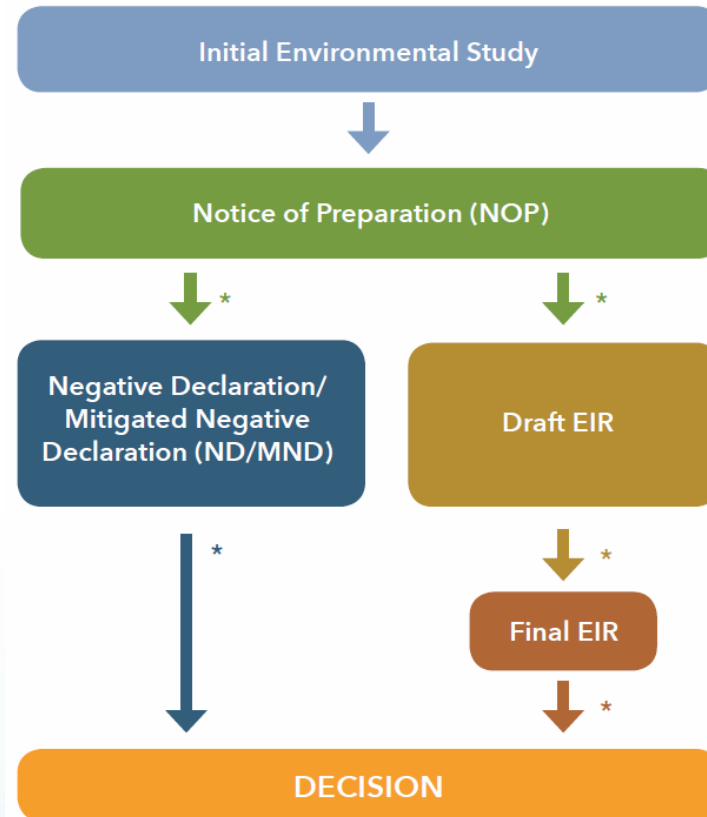
Projects between 50 and 100 MW- Small Power Plant Exemption

- Option for applicant to obtain Small Power Plant Exemption from CEC (Section 25541 of Warren-Alquist Act)
- CEC staff performs environmental review (general CEQA)
- If no unmitigable impacts, project exempt from CEC licensing
- Local agency may permit



General CEQA Process

The CEQA process at a glance



Each * represents a place in the process where public comments on the proposal are accepted. Comments are important because only comments/concerns raised during the comment period are eligible for legal review. Only people or groups that have commented have legal standing.

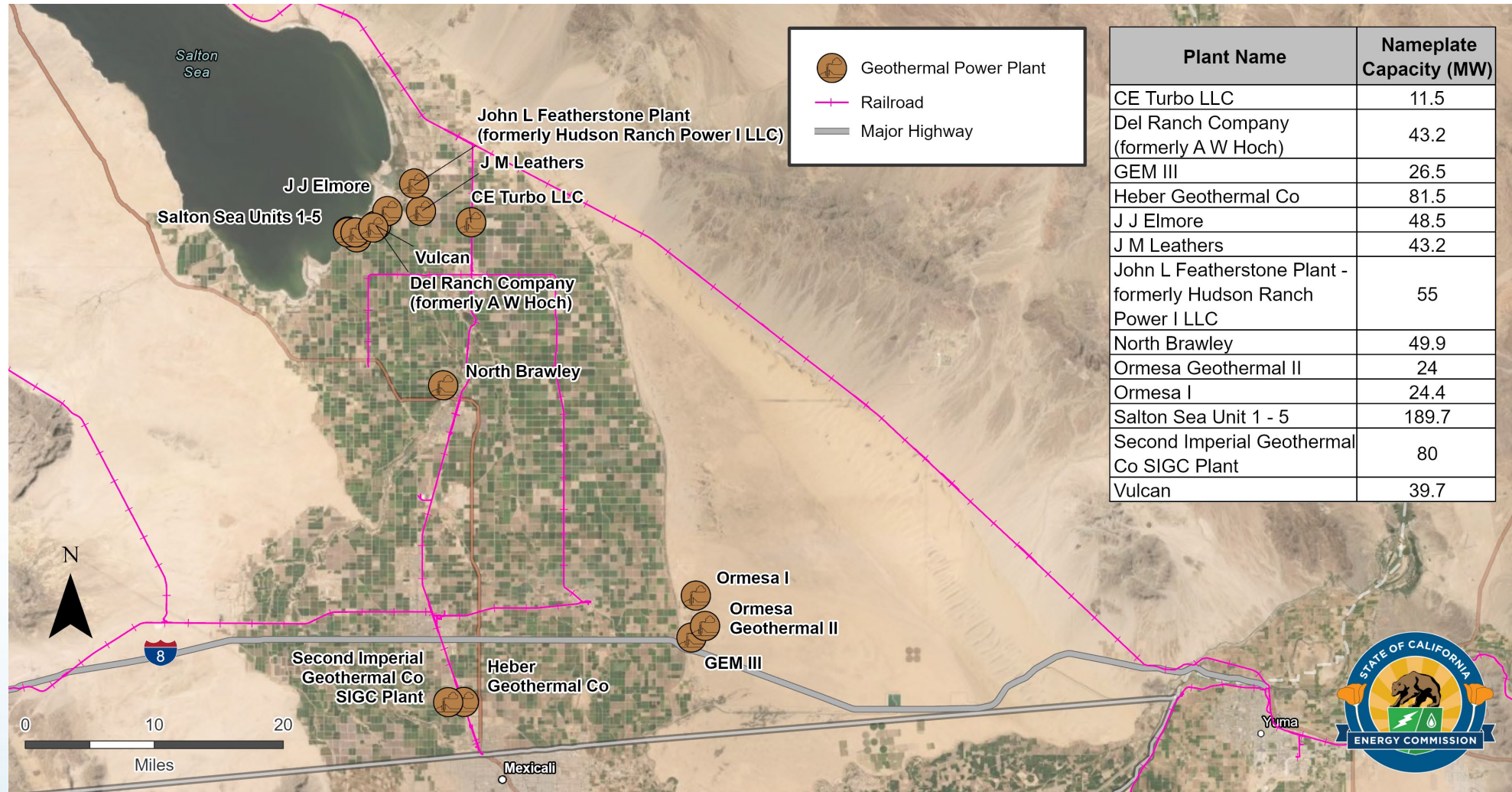


Examples of Geothermal Permitting

 - 110 MW
 - Certified by the CEC in September 1979
- Coso Navy 2
 - 80 MW
 - Granted a Small Power Plant Exemption by the CEC on December 14, 1988

- Reports to CEC Chair
- Advises public and CEC
- Not representative or advocate of the public

Duties in Advising Public (PRC §25222)

- Shall insure that full and adequate participation by all interested groups and the public at large is secured
- Shall insure that timely and complete notice of commission meetings and public hearings is disseminated to all interested groups and to the public at large
- Shall advise such groups and the public as to effective ways of participating in the commission's proceedings
- Shall recommend to the commission additional measures to assure open consideration and public participation
 - In energy planning, site and facility certification, energy conservation, and emergency allocation procedures



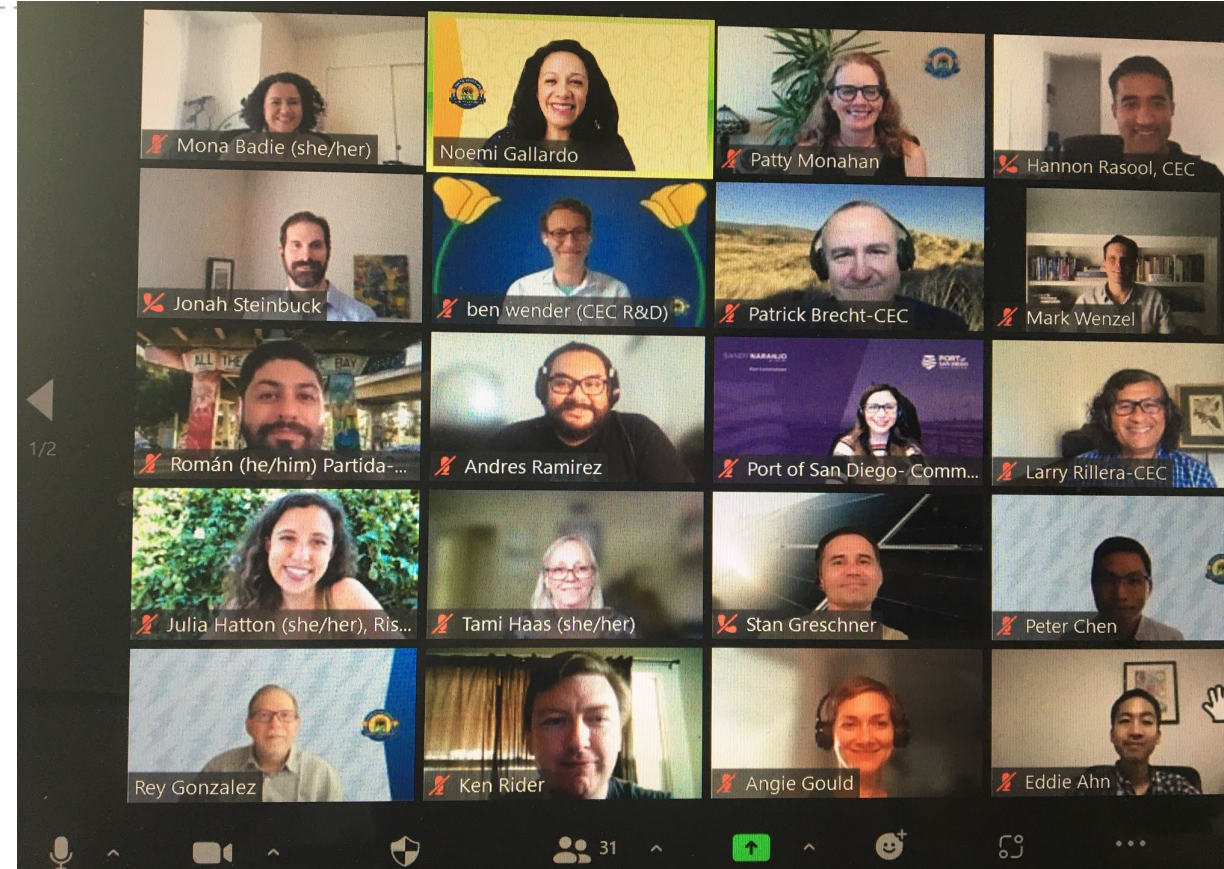
Duties in Advising Public (Title 20 §2556)

- Respond to certain inquiries > Respond to all inquiries, log correspondence
- Establish roster > Maintain robust contact database
- Refer to staff > Work with SMEs to ensure response
- Solicit participation > Engage stakeholders where they are, hand-hold thru process
- Relate points upon request > Educate, offer services

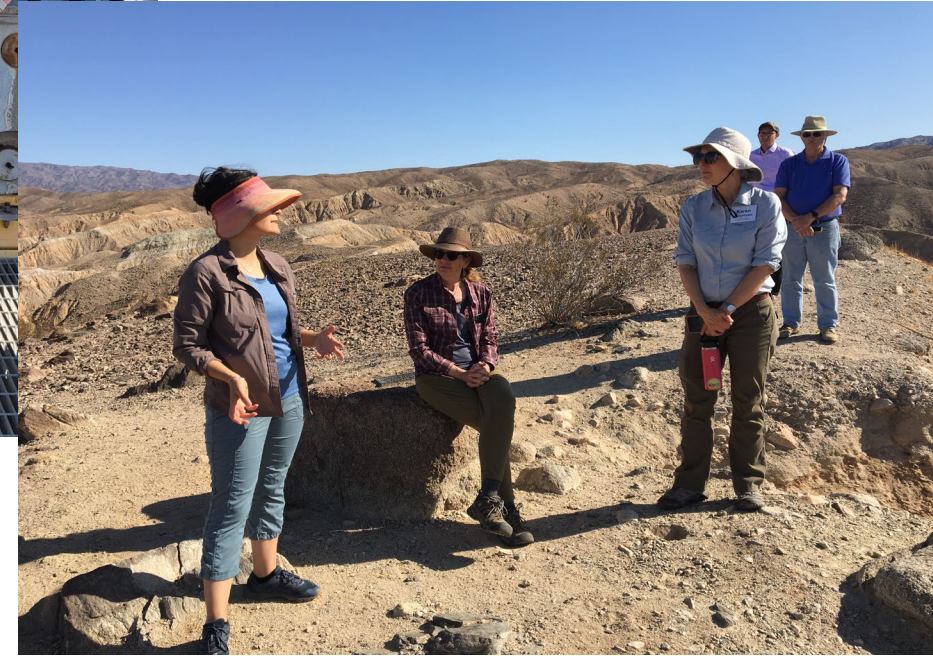

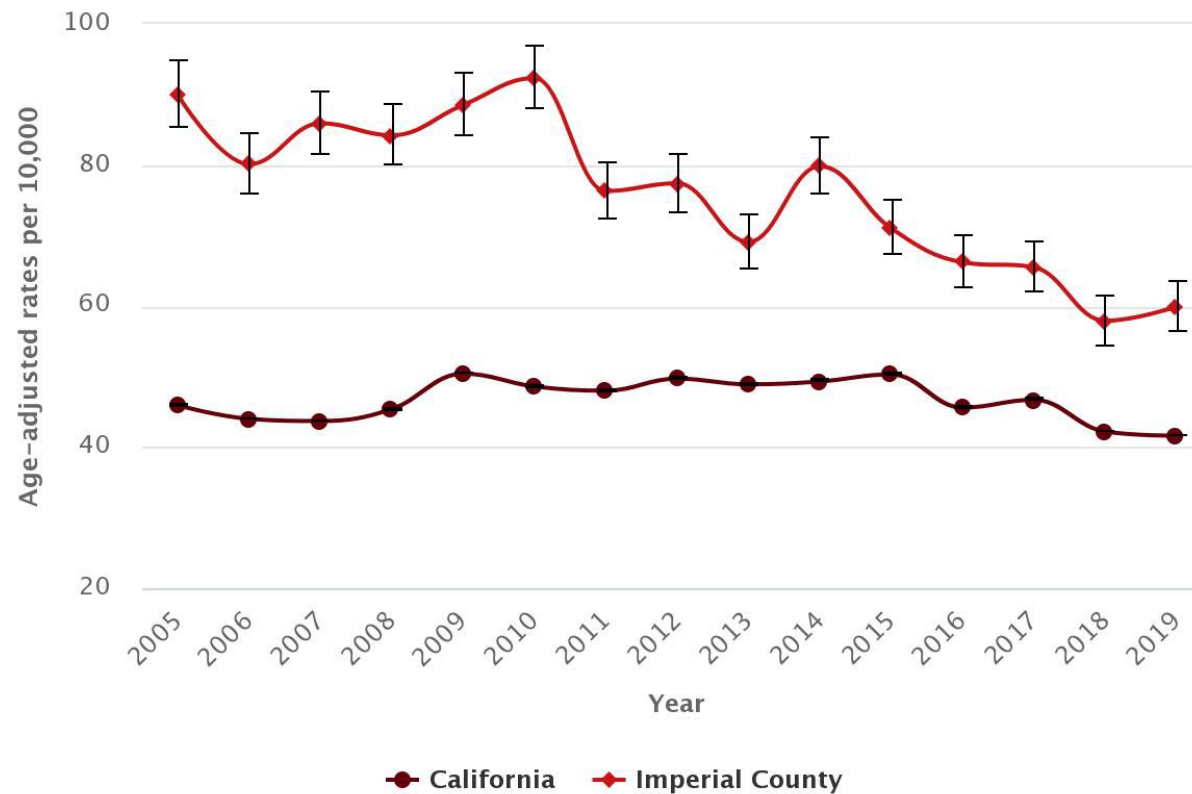

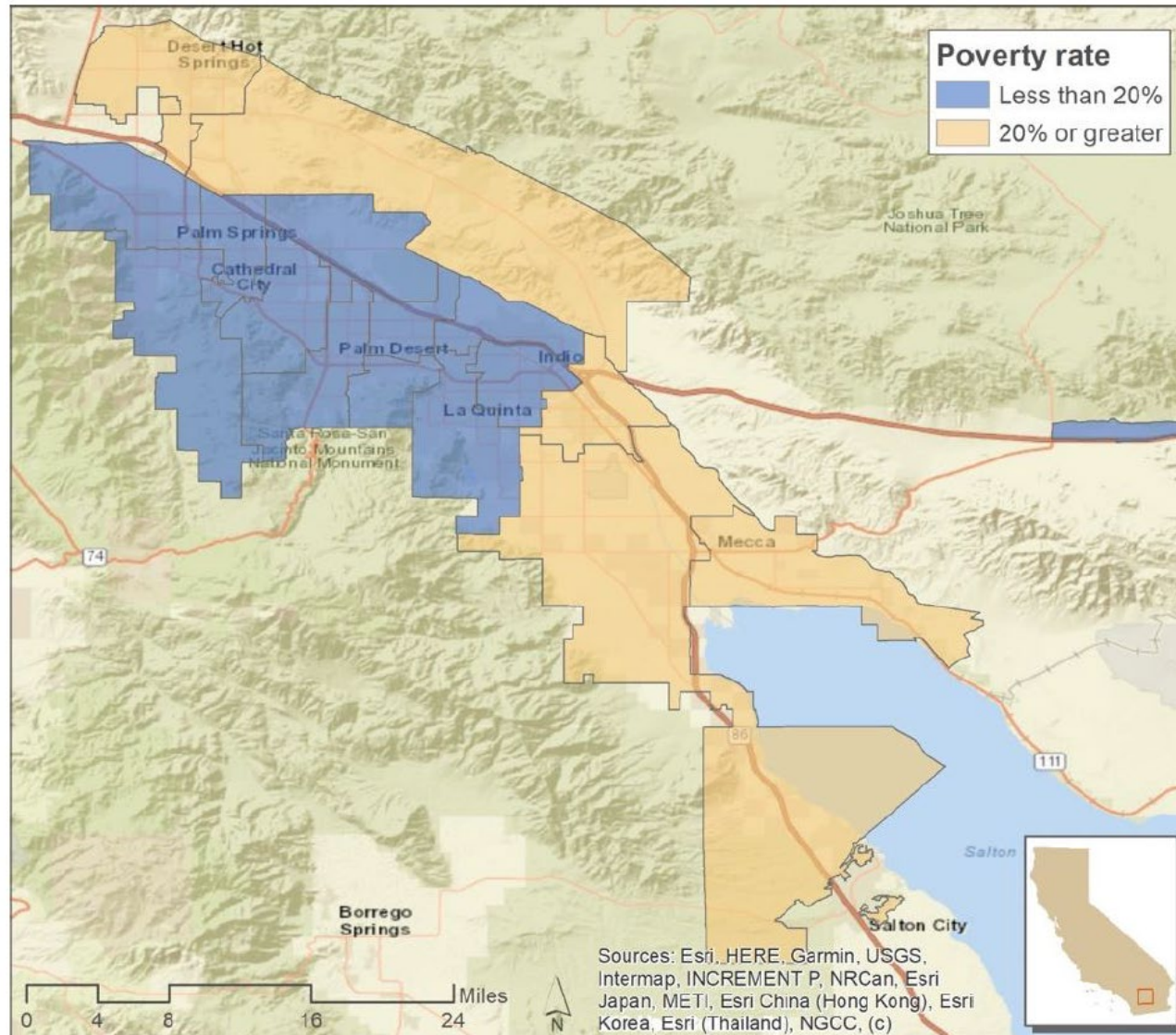
History of Poor Health Outcomes in Eastern Coachella/Imperial Valleys



Emergency department visits due to asthma, Both sexes, All Ages/Races, Imperial County



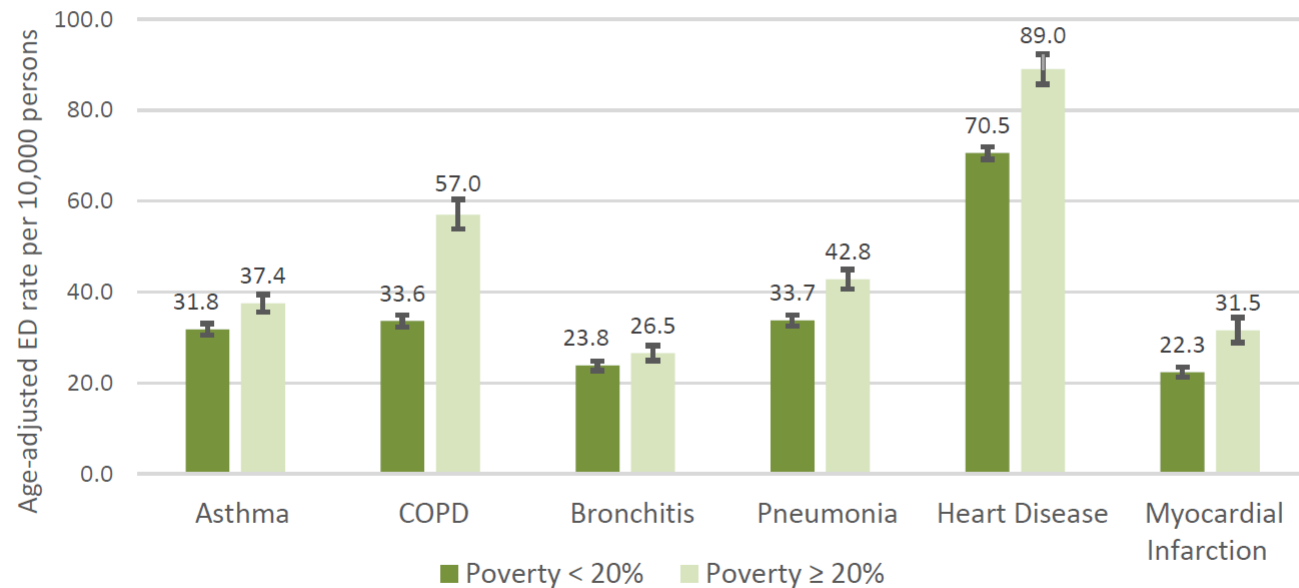

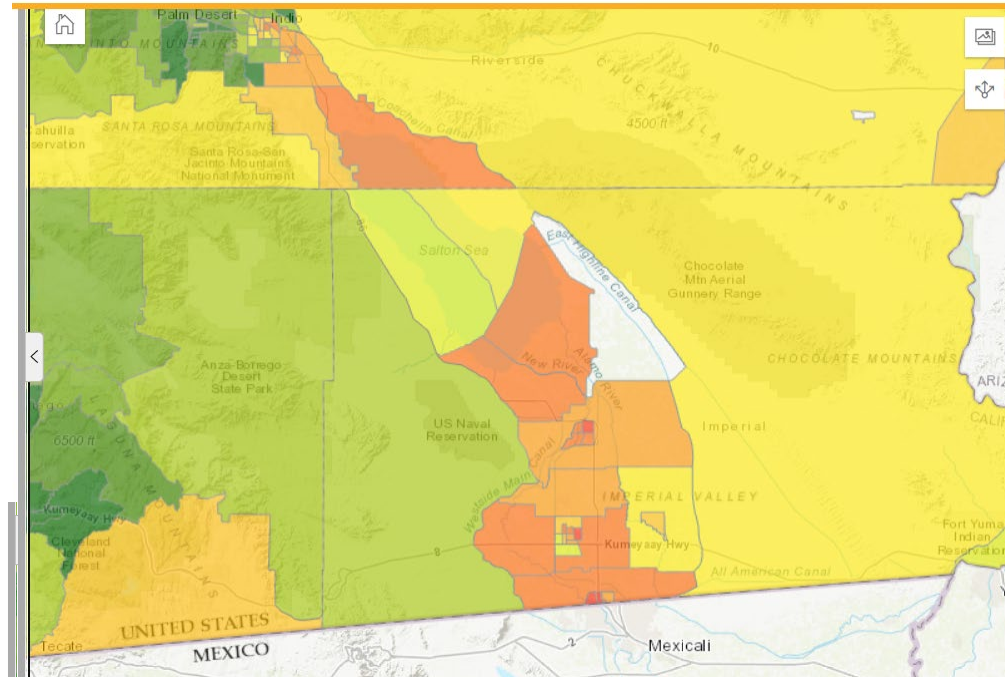
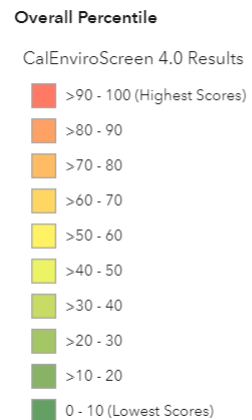
Figure 5. Age-adjusted ED visit rates per 10,000 for lower- and higher-poverty ZIP codes in the Coachella Valley, 2016-2018. COPD includes ages 25+ and MI includes ages 35+; all other conditions are all ages. Includes 95% confidence intervals.



Environmental Exposures



Census tracts around the Salton Sea are in top 2 deciles of cumulative impacts according to Cal/EPA (CalEnviroScreen 4.0) “disproportionately burdened by multiple sources of pollution”



Best Practices: EIR vs. HIA



California Supreme Court (2019): EIR must show a “reasonable effort to substantively connect a project’s air quality impacts to likely health consequences”

However: A Health Impact Assessment is “a more complete analysis of health effects [which] would consider all potentially significant direct, indirect, and cumulative health impacts associated with the proposed action and alternatives.” (Human Impact Partners, 2022)

“Health Impact Assessment provides a framework.. to determine the potential positive and negative effects of a proposed policy, plan or development project on human health and how those impacts might be distributed within the population. (Dannenberg, et al 2006)

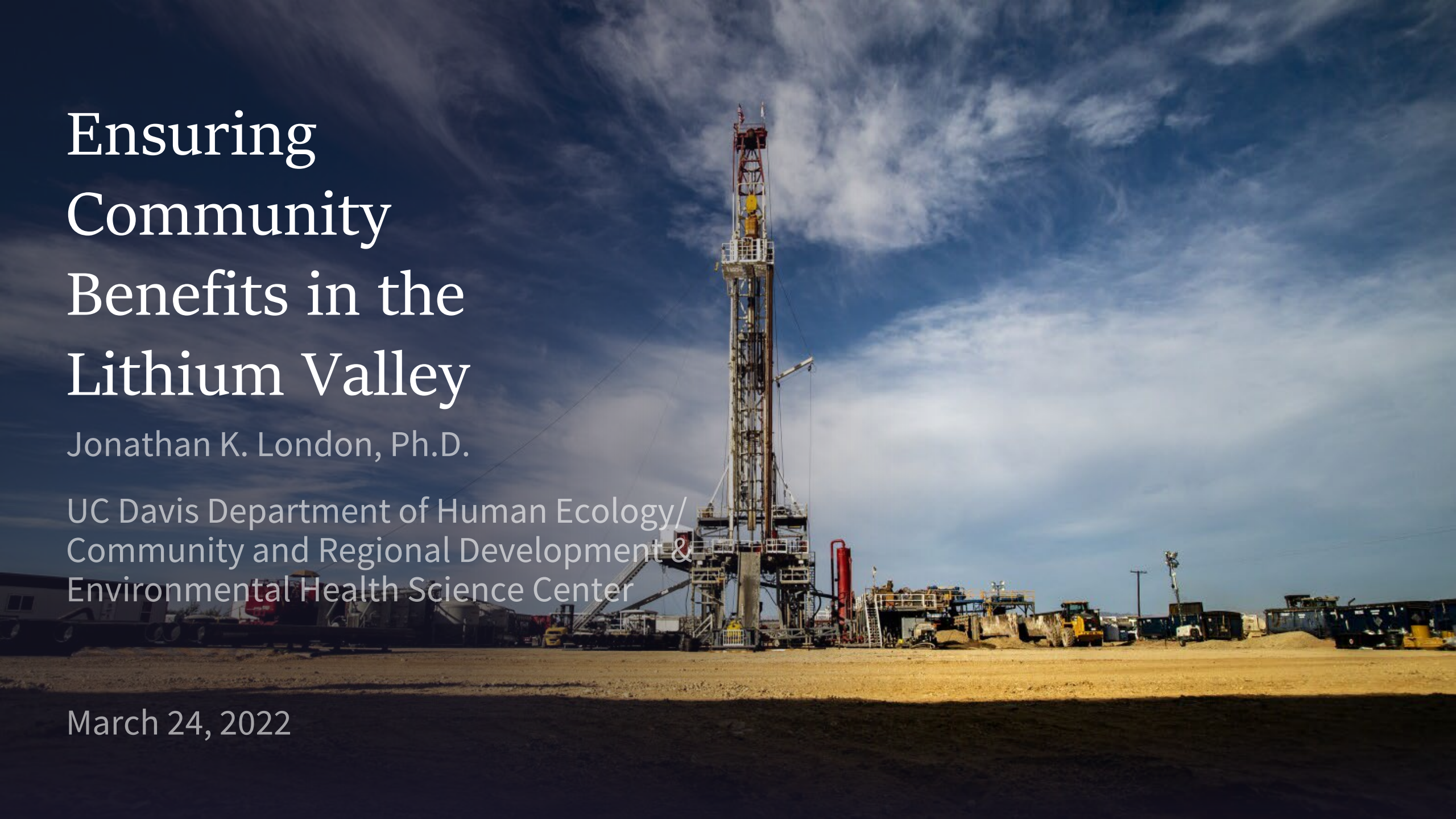

Take Away Points

- Mining impacts on communities provide cautionary tale
- Environmental Justice is an appropriate goal for the development of the Lithium Valley
- CEQA intended to promote transparent, accountable and democratic governance → process matters
- CEQA should be the floor, not the ceiling
 - HIA & Community Benefits Agreements



Context: Mining Dependent Communities

- Boom and bust cycles
- Long-term environmental impacts/ lack of long-term accountability
- Limited educational/ career pathways into better paying jobs
- Inadequate investments in community well-being
- Imbalance between economic and other community interests

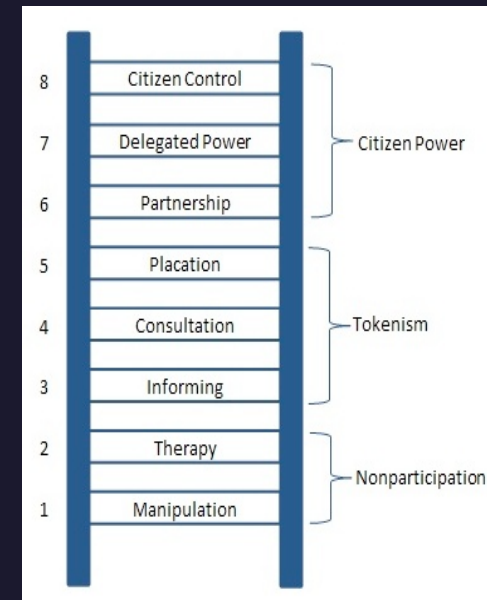

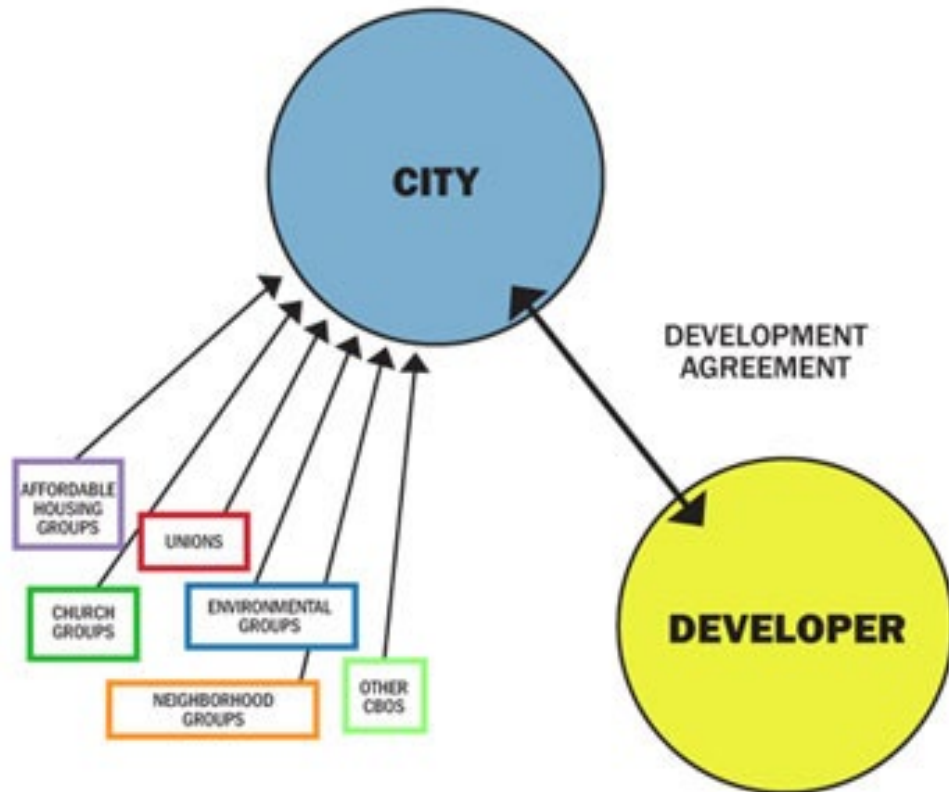

EJ Recommendations

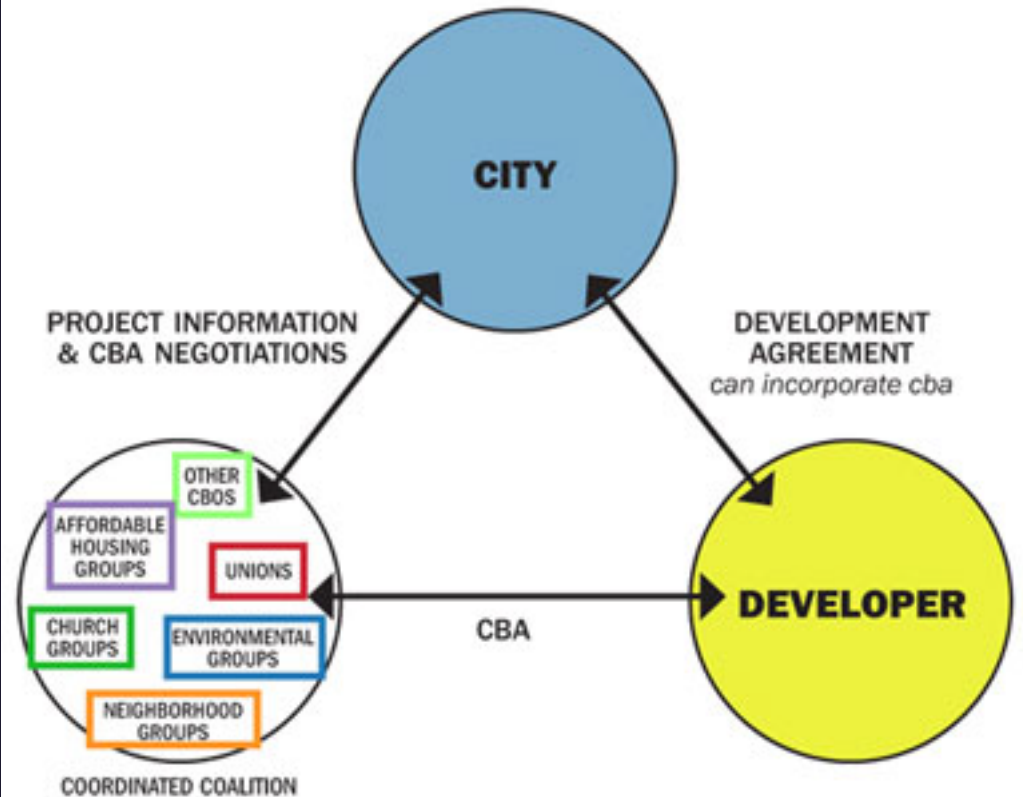
- Focus on engagement and impacts for the most over-burdened and disadvantaged people

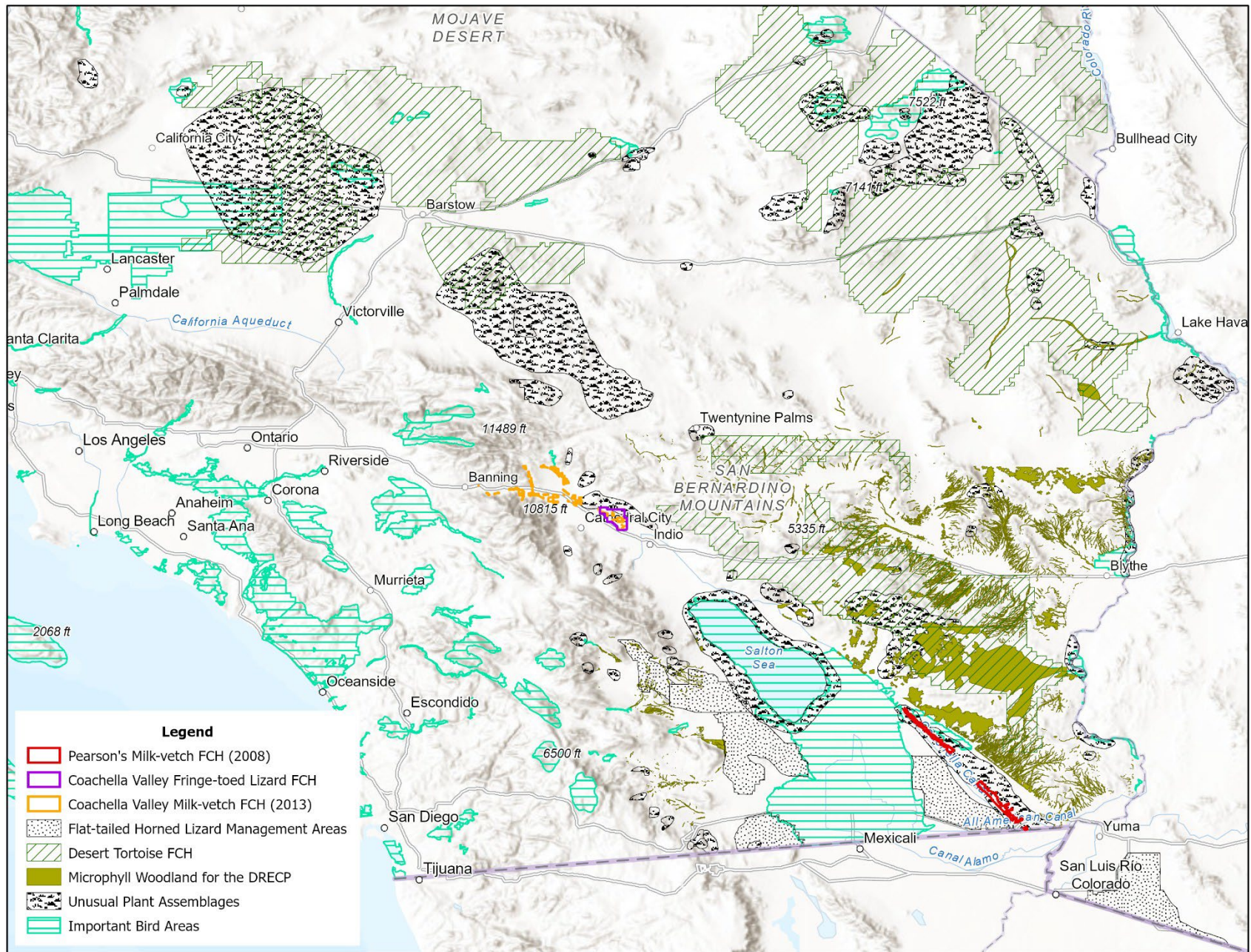

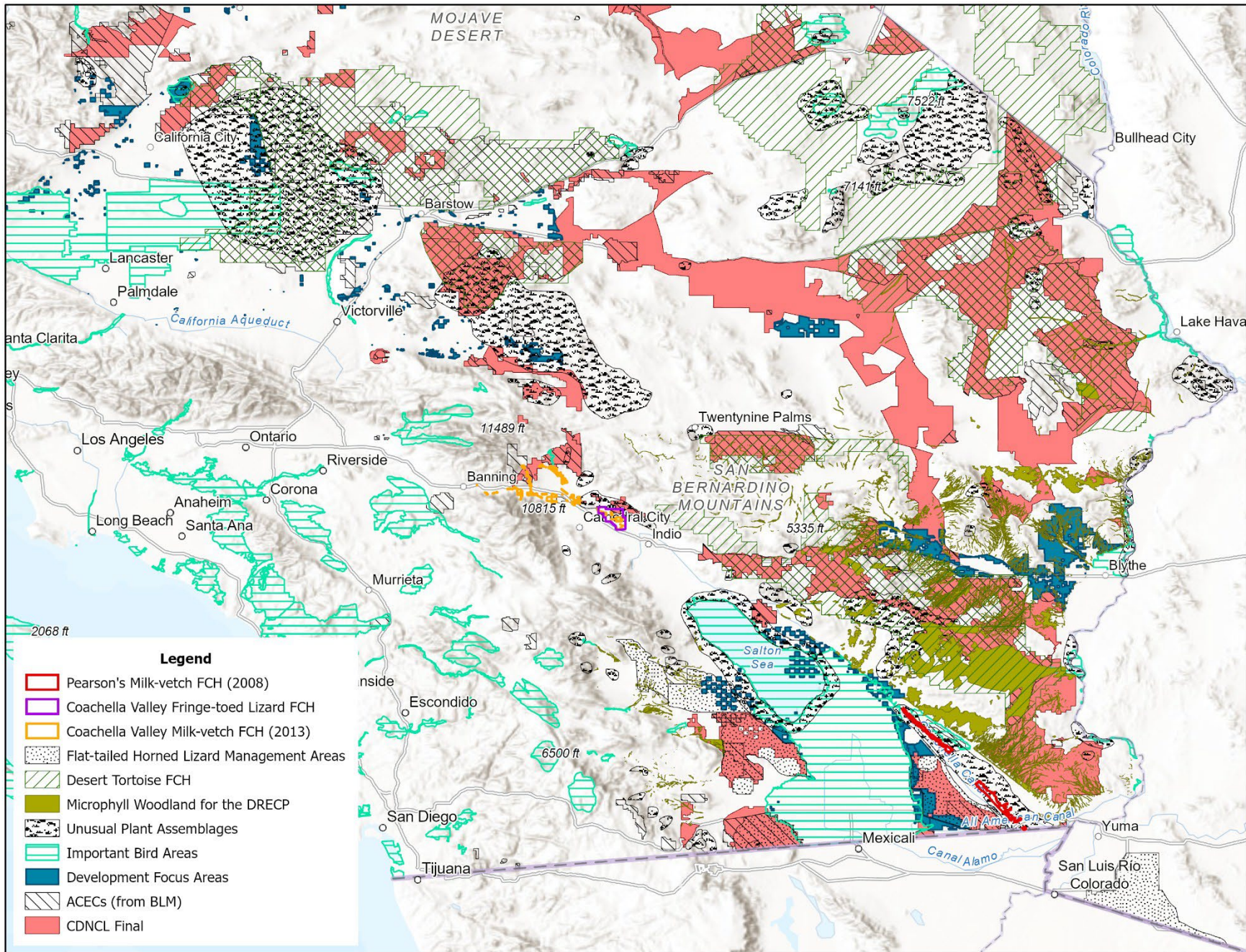

Lithium Valley Economic Opportunity Investment Plan (LVIP)

- ▶ ***Lithium Valley Economic Opportunity Investment Plan*** outlines the specific actions that the County of Imperial will take and provides our request(s) of the State and Federal Government to encourage economic investment in our region.

The goal of the plan is to generate investment resulting in career and economic opportunities for Imperial County residents

Process of Creating LVIP

- ▶ Over the past few years, industry, community groups and local/regional government officials have been engaged in both informal and formal meetings/communication regarding the economic potential for lithium & other rare mineral extraction and geothermal energy production in Imperial County.
- ▶ The LVIP takes into account the information received by literally over 100 different participants and provides a roadmap of action of the County of Imperial and the requested actions of both the State and Federal Government.

Actions of the County of Imperial

- ▶ Create Lithium Valley Economic Opportunity Investment Plan Subcommittee (2 members) of the Board of Supervisors & internal working group of County CEO, Counsel and Directors
- ▶ Seek voter approval to establish remuneration for lithium/rare mineral mining and power generation/storage to provide appropriate financial benefits to the County and community organizations that further the economic interests of the region and address environmental/infrastructure impacts
- ▶ Encourage Processing Vertical Integrated Investment by providing tax credits for lithium/rare mineral processing and manufacturing
- ▶ Establish a Lithium Valley Project Ombudsperson to work directly with lithium/rare-mineral mining and renewable energy generation industry representatives
- ▶ Explore economic viability of an Enhanced Infrastructure Finance District (EIFD) to finance infrastructure improvements.
- ▶ Provide leadership (Subcommittee of the Board of Supervisors) and professional staff resources to work directly with the State and Federal Government on their portion of the Investment Plan.

Requested State of California Actions

- ▶ Delegate planning and permitting authority of Geothermal Development up to 99.9 Megawatts to the County of Imperial. (Currently limited to 49.9 Megawatts)
- ▶ Provide Direct Funding County for the Lithium Valley Specific Plan and Programmatic Environmental Impact Report (\$5,000,000)
- ▶ Direct Funding to the County of Imperial for the Lithium Valley Development Office for a period of ten (10 years) beginning with the FY 2022-23 State Budget
- ▶ State of California Support and Assistance in creation of an Imperial County Severance Tax or Resource Levy (remuneration) for critical minerals.
- ▶ Support and Funding (\$100 million) of a Cal-Poly campus in Imperial County (or expansion of current/past efforts) to include educational opportunities in engineering, geology and chemistry for which to train/support the lithium industry in Imperial County)
- ▶ Support and Seed-Funding a reference lab for lithium purity testing
- ▶ Go-Biz Tax Credit Carve-Out for Lithium, Geothermal (\$25 million over 5 Years)
- ▶ Executive Order or Legislative Action exempting lithium/rare-mineral and geothermal producers from additional compliance from CEQA after PEIR and SP

Requested Actions of the Federal Government

- ▶ *Roads & Bridges:* Imperial County needs an allocation of \$50 million to provide for road and bridge infrastructure to portions of the region where lithium/rare-mineral mining and renewable power generation occur.
- ▶ *Railways:* \$1 billion of railway upgrades in the form of additional tracks, loading and siding/spur infrastructure.
- ▶ *Electrical Grid:* \$500 million in funding offsets for grid upgrades and wheeling charges from energy producers.
- ▶ *Environmental Remediation:* \$500 million in direct funding and/or loan guarantees for companies that desire to build/operate End of Life Recycling and Reuse facilities in Imperial County

County Board of Supervisors Press Conference

- ▶ The Imperial County Board of Supervisors will host a Press Conference at 10:00am on Friday February 18, 2022 in the Board Chambers to present the Lithium Valley Economic Investment Plan and discuss plan specifics.
- ▶ The County Board of Supervisors, County Executive Staff and Department Directors will be available at that time to discuss the plan and implementation

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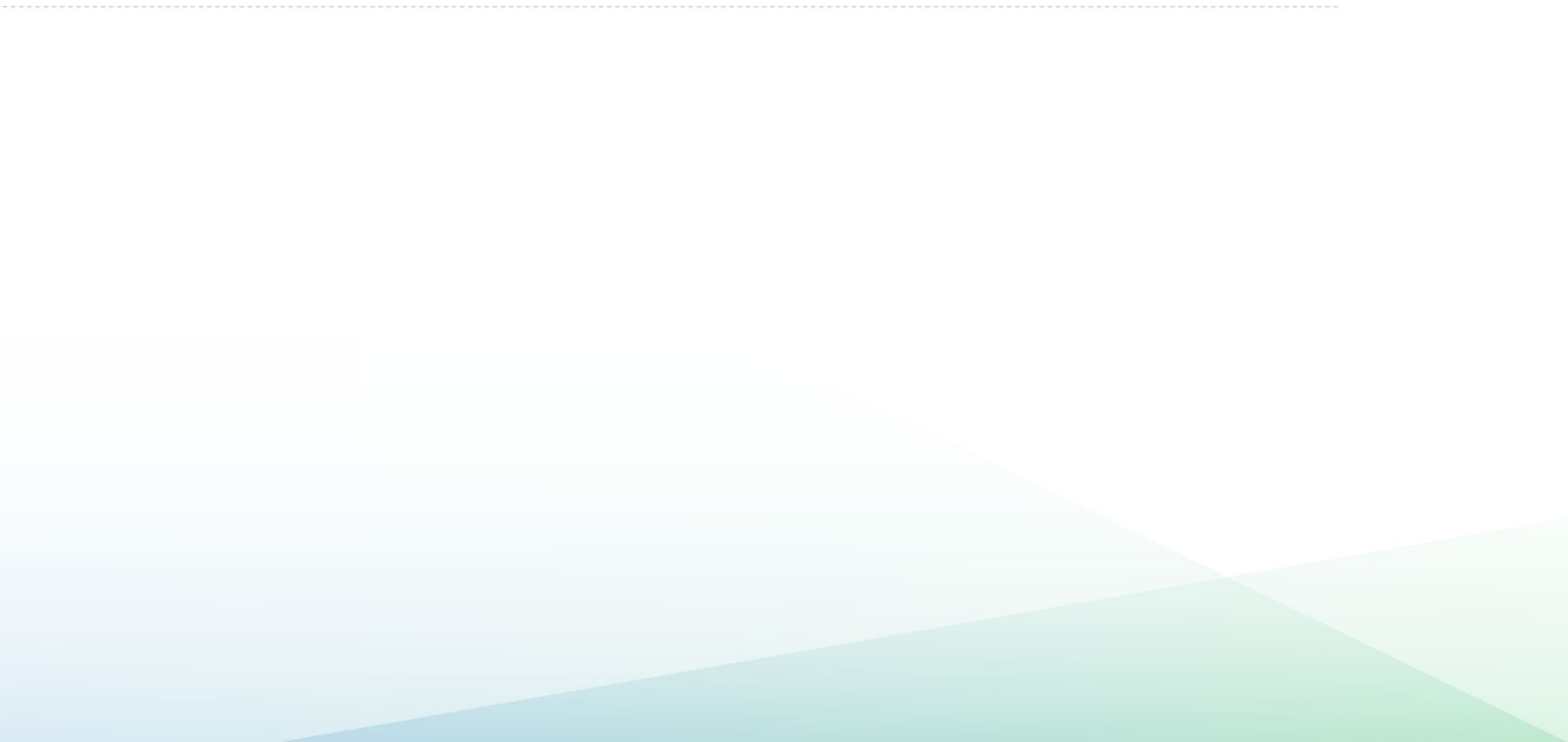
