Please be advised that the City Council of the City of Emeryville has adopted amendments to the 2019 Edition of the California Building Energy Efficiency Standards Code via Ordinance No. 21-006, enclosed.

In accordance with Public Resources Code Section 25402.1 (h)2 and Section 10-106 of the Building Energy Efficiency Standards, this package of materials includes City of Emeryville proposed local ordinance requiring more stringent energy requirements than those set by California's 2019 Building Energy Efficiency Standards Title 24, Part 6. The ordinance was adopted by the City Council of the City of Emeryville on September 13, 2021 and will become effective following approval by the California Energy Commission. This application to the California Energy Commission is based on the collective reach code adoption preparation performed by Peninsula Clean Energy and Silicon Valley Clean Energy.

- Att. 2: Staff report to the City Council of the City of Emeryville, outlining the goals of the updated building standards
- Att. 3: Signed Ordinance No. 21-006, which adopts updates to the City's Building Ordinance, including requirements for energy reach standards beyond Title 24, Part 6 baseline for residential and nonresidential new construction, additions, and alterations. This provides clear requirements that buildings be designed to consume no more energy than permitted by Part 6.
- Att. 4: Checklists that outline local energy efficiency and green building standards, provided to increase clarity to applicants about project-specific requirements.
- Att. 5: Cost effectiveness studies, including an overview of their specific applications in the ordinance update, demonstrating the expected energy savings and the cost effectiveness of the ordinance in the City of Emeryville, Climate Zone 3.

The City will continue to enforce Title 24, Part 6, as well as the proposed ordinance. The by Title 24, Part 6. The proposed standards are more protective of the environment than proposed ordinance will require buildings to consume no more energy than is permitted the State standards, and there are no reasonably foreseeable adverse impacts, and so there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment. As the lead agency, the City has also determined that this activity is exempt from CEQA under section 15061(b)(3).
