Dear Lorelei:

We understand that Hydrostor has requested an extension of time for its current 90-day Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to continue geologic data collection activities—the borehole drilling program—at the proposed Gem Energy Storage Center site in Kern County. Typically, geotechnical data collection activities are conducted prior to the filing of an application for certification (AFC) with the California Energy Commission (CEC). When applicants need to conduct additional data collection activities in support of an AFC, the CEC staff will advise applicants of the need to obtain local permits for the activities.

The data collection activities currently underway and planned at the Gem site are important and will provide necessary information to support the CEC staff's analysis of the Gem AFC. The CEC staff can confirm that we would need to evaluate the results of Hydrostor's borehole drilling program, as described in Hydrostor's April 1, 2022, application for a CUP, before we can complete our Preliminary Staff Assessment.
