DCNPP should shut down as scheduled in 2025

Dear Commissioners:

I urge you to keep Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant (DCNPP) on schedule to shut down in 2025. As a San Luis Obispo County resident about 8 miles from DCNPP, I get a little upset when panels of prestige- and privilege-laden scientists who don't live anywhere near DCNPP-- and whose fields of expertise often lie far afield from nuclear power-- argue to keep this 50-year-old power plant up and running, taxing complex aged hardware and generating extra nuclear waste past 2025. It becomes increasingly and unacceptably risky to run this complex facility past its design lifetime.
