I am outraged to hear that you are considering extending the closing date for the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Plant. Are the 2016 and 2018 closure agreements, negotiated by our elected representatives, meaningless? What about the millions of dollars that taxpayers have already spent on decommissioning costs?

The corporate operator of this facility, PG&E, has been convicted of numerous felonies, is responsible for dozens of human deaths, with thousands of homes and businesses burned to the ground, and hundreds of thousands of acres devastated. U.S. District Court Judge William Alsup called PG&E a "continuing menace to California." With such a history of reckless operations, we cannot trust PG&E to run Diablo Canyon one minute longer than the closure agreement provides.

The location of the Diablo facility, near multiple active earthquake faults, and its aging infrastructure, are continuing public safety concerns.
