


THE MEXICAN COMMUNITY TAKES COLLECTIVE ACTION

About five months later, a group of thirty-three Colonia residents further exposed the institutionalized indifference toward Mexicans when they requested the city to move the dump away from their neighborhood. The newspaper reprint of their petition confirmed the Red Cross women's prior statement that when "treated like human beings" Mexicans would "respond."

Oxnard, Calif., June 1, 1922.

Members of the Oxnard City Council.

Gentlemen—We, the undersigned, residents and taxpayers of the city of Oxnard, and living in that section known as Colonia Home Gardens, due west and north of the city dumping grounds, do hereby respectfully petition the city council of Oxnard to declare the present city dumping grounds a public nuisance, unsanitary, and menacing to the health of the inhabitants in its near vicinity, and menacing as well to our livestock and garden plants, both of which are vitally essential and necessary to our peaceful endeavor of earning our living and sustaining the health of ourselves, our wives, our children, and others who may abide with us.

Not only has the city of Oxnard outgrown its present dumping facility, necessitating an immediate removal from its present location, but we declare said dumping ground unsightly, a breeder of disease, a menace to the health and to the moral stability of contentment to residents nearby. We therefore respectfully ask that the city council appoint a committee to investigate the truth of our grievance and to act upon our suggestion and the results of your committee's investigation with American fairness and Christian sympathy.








Zoning in Oxnard






CARB Pollution Mapping Tool (v2.5)




A Growing Environmental Justice Movement in Oxnard
