- 375 EV chargers
- Level 1 & 2 installations, lowering costs
- 75% of installs in affordable housing communities

Scalable Charging to Enable Majority EV Ownership (SCHEME)

- 100 Level 2 chargers
- Innovative Smart EV circuit breaker allows for a lower cost installation
- About 75% anticipated to be installed in disadvantaged communities
