Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) appreciates the California Energy Commission (CEC) for hosting a webinar on September 19, 2022, to present the Opt-In Certification Provisions of Assembly Bill (AB) 205 and presenting the proposed emergency regulations to implement this newly established certification program at the CEC.

PG&E understands that AB 205 authorizes the CEC to accept applications for the certification of certain non-fossil-fueled power plants, energy storage facilities, and related manufacturing facilities. PG&E supports the purpose of this program to accelerate California's transition to clean energy and help maintain reliable sources of clean energy.
