The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a workshop to engage with the public regarding the incorporation of the California Utility Allowance Calculator (CUAC) into the California Building Energy Code Compliance (CBECC) software.

The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the attendance instructions below. The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted and the end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

Agenda

CEC staff will present benefits to the public, overall context, and development progress for the incorporation of CUAC into CBECC 2.0. CEC's presentation content will cover appearance and functionality of the new proposed CUAC tool. CEC will seek input from the public on the presented content and seek input on the proposed developments to the CUAC.

Background

The CUAC is currently a stand-alone tool used to estimate monthly utility bills for tenants and is approved by the State Treasurer's Office for calculating utility estimates (Treasury Regulation 26 CFR §1.42-10). CUAC is used when applying for tax credits through the California Tax Credit Allocation Committee (CTCAC)¹ in coordination with the California Debt Limit Allocation Committee (CDLAC). CTCAC allocates federal and state low-income housing tax credits to support affordable housing, most commonly for multifamily buildings. CUAC provides a project specific means for establishing utility allowances, which enables investments in energy improvements to be recognized by the marketplace. It is typically more accurate than using public housing authority (PHA) utility allowance schedules that are not project specific. Currently, CUAC submittals must be signed by a Certified Energy Analyst (CEA) who is also either a certified Home Energy Rating System (HERS) Rater or a California licensed Mechanical Engineer or Electrical Engineer.

In partnership with the State Treasurer's Office, the CEC updates and maintains the CUAC. The current CUAC is a stand-alone Microsoft Access (MS) program with a user interface allowing different inputs for new and existing projects. Incorporating the CUAC into the state's Energy Code compliance software (CBECC) is intended to be a process improvement for affordable housing developers since newly constructed homes are already required to demonstrate compliance with the Energy Code using the compliance software. The proposed advancements are expected to eliminate manual importing of results from CBECC runs into the currently separate stand-alone MS-based tool and brings the CUAC under the care of the more substantial development and user support team responsible for CBECC.

The CEC seeks input from the public on the proposed developments to the CUAC.
