The lead commissioner for the *2022 Integrated Energy Policy Report (2022 IEPR Update)*, Vice Chair Siva Gunda, seeks public comment on the draft report. ## **Background**

Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the CEC to prepare an IEPR every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. The CEC uses these assessments and forecasts to develop and evaluate energy policies and programs that conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety.

Public Resources Code Section 25302(e) directs state government entities to use the information and analyses contained in the adopted IEPR to carry out their energy-related duties and responsibilities. The CEC has coordinated closely with other agencies to ensure consistency in the underlying information used to develop this report.

The IEPR lead commissioner issued a <u>scoping order</u>, available at https://efiling.energy.ca.gov/GetDocument.aspx?tn=242747&DocumentContentId=76300, on April 22, 2022, identifying topics for the report. As detailed in the scoping order, the *2022 IEPR Update* focuses on the following:

- Establishing a framework to center equity and environmental justice throughout CEC efforts and revisiting the Energy Equity Indicators
- Creating a California Energy Planning Library

- Updating the California Energy Demand Forecast
- Addressing emerging topics, including energy reliability, western electricity integration, the role of hydrogen in California's clean energy future, gasoline prices, fossil gas transition, and distributed energy resources.

The CEC held nine workshops and one webinar between April and October 2022 (three additional workshops are scheduled in November and December) on the topics identified in the scoping order. Information from the workshops and public comments were key inputs in developing the *Draft 2022 IEPR Update*. All workshop documents including agendas, background material, transcripts, presentations, and public comments, are available on the CEC's 2022 IEPR Update web page at https://www.energy.ca.gov/data-reports/reports/integrated-energy-policy-report/2022-integrated-energy-policy-report-update.

Under the direction of the lead commissioner, the CEC will carefully review comments received on the *Draft 2022 IEPR Update* and make changes as needed in response to comments. The report will also be updated to include forecast results and to reflect market updates as needed. The final draft is expected to be available by late January 2022 to be considered for adoption at the CEC's business meeting on February 15, 2023.
