Dear CEC ESR Team,

On June 3rd, 2021, the CPUC Tribal Land Transfer received an inquiry from yak tit/u tit/u yak tiłhini, known locally as "ytt" tribe to acquire the parcels associated with Diablo Canyon Power Plant.

With the passage of AB 846 to continue operations of Diablo Canyon Power Plant, the tribe must be consulted on the road ahead.

Despite recognition from the Governor's office and the city of San Luis Obispo, ytt tribe was not mentioned in SB 846. Despite language in the bill text regarding the importance of California's indigenous history, the tribe is trespessed upon by Section 13 (A), which offers for \$150,000,000 to conservation groups to provide public access to the lands. This is wrong. ytt tribe deserves to lead the conservation effort of their ancestral homeland.

By excluding the tribe from agency over their ancestral homeland, the state of California is committing theft and colonization against indigenous people. I urge the CEC to seek the tribe's input on what should happen to the land and the powerplant.
