The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a workshop to discuss three key dimensions of western integration: markets, transmission, and resource adequacy. # Agenda

The workshop will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. with a break at approximately 12:30 p.m. and resuming at approximately 1:30 p.m.

The workshop will include three panels with substantive presentations by subject matter experts on their most current analysis of the three key dimensions of Western system integration: markets, transmission, and resource adequacy. The panels will include representatives of key initiatives making presentations from an interconnection-wide view.

## Morning

The workshop will begin with a plenary session in which western state regulators offer a brief comment on the current status of integration.

Following the plenary session, the first panel will discuss market developments and the potential for these efforts to enable potential economic and environmental benefits of regional integration.

The second panel will be introduced in the morning and completed in the afternoon. This panel will highlight the critical role of transmission planning in integration efforts and discuss challenges and opportunities with implementing multi-state projects and inter-regional planning.

#### Afternoon

The afternoon will open with the continuation of the transmission panel.

Next, a third panel on resource adequacy will explore the importance of resource adequacy to regional integration efforts and recent developments in resource adequacy programs.

The final session of the workshop will be a dialogue among regulators and panelists, reflecting on the discussions throughout the day and a presentation by California Independent System Operator staff summarizing existing assessments of the benefits and costs of increased western electricity system integration.

There will be an opportunity for public comments at the end of the day.

## Background

The <u>Scoping Order for the 2022 Integrated Energy Policy Report Update</u>, available at https://efiling.energy.ca.gov/GetDocument.aspx?tn=242747&DocumentContentId=76300, identifies the "evolving regional energy markets" as part of "addressing emerging topics." The aim is "to provide situational awareness and identify possible policy questions of interest."

The current integration landscape before western electricity system leaders looks quite different than just a few years ago. The carbon reduction goals, policy directives, and economics driving the transition to clean energy systems continue to reshape the western resource mix, prospective regional markets and the transmission planning needed to support these changes.

The workshop purpose is to convene the analysts and decisionmakers who are leading initiatives to increase the integration of electricity systems in the Western Interconnection. The workshop is part of the record on which CEC's *2022 IEPR Update* will be based. This hallmark document is a key CEC mandate that seeks to guide near-term decision-making about our longer-term policies.

The goal in holding this workshop is to build a factual record capturing current integration status so that California and other western states can evaluate policy options in 2023 and beyond. This is not intended as advocacy of any initiative or policy direction. Rather, it seeks to fulfill a common need to understand the current lay of the land.

## **Public Comment**

**Oral comments** will be accepted at the end of the day. Comments may be limited to three minutes or less per speaker and one person per organization. Depending on the number of members of the public seeking to make a comment, the facilitator may adjust the total time allotted for public comment and the time allotted for each comment.
