**ORDER REFERRING APPLICANT'S MOTION TO
DISSOLVE THE COMMITTEE TO THE FULL COMMISSION
AND EXTENDING TIME TO RULE**

BACKGROUND

On December 10, 2021, STACK Infrastructure (Applicant) submitted an application for a small power plant exemption (SPPE) for the SVY Backup Generating Facility (Application)¹ to the California Energy Commission (CEC). On May 11, 2022, the CEC appointed a committee to preside over the proceeding arising from the Application (Committee).² On August 2, 2022, the Committee held a committee conference,³ and subsequently issued a scheduling order on September 15, 2022.⁴ On November 28, 2022, Staff filed a status report indicating Staff anticipates publishing a draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) by January 27, 2023.⁵

On December 12, 2022, Applicant filed a motion seeking to dissolve the Committee on the grounds that the Committee will no longer be necessary under updated SPPE regulations that, upon their effective date, will eliminate the adjudicatory process for this proceeding (Applicant's Motion).⁶ New SPPE regulations took effect on December

14, 2022, eliminating the adjudicatory process for all SPPE proceedings.⁷ On December 16, 2022, Staff responded to Applicant's Motion, agreeing that the new SPPE regulations eliminated the adjudicatory process, and recommending therefore that the Committee refer the STACK proceeding back to the full Commission to dissolve the Committee under the authority of Title 20 of the California Code of Regulations sections 1203(c) and 1204(c).⁸

DISCUSSION

Applicant's Motion relates to whether the CEC, in light of the updated SPPE regulations, may wish to dissolve the Committee assigned to the STACK proceeding. It is appropriate to refer Applicant's Motion to the full Commission for consideration at a noticed public business meeting.⁹

Because the CEC is not scheduled to convene a public business meeting until January 25, 2023, the time for the CEC to rule on Applicant's Motion must be extended to prevent it from being denied by action of law 30 days after its filing.¹⁰ Here, an extension to February 8, 2023, for a CEC ruling on Applicant's Motion, would allow for the CEC action on the motion at the January 25, 2023, business meeting and additional time, as needed, to issue a written ruling.

ORDERS

Applicant's Motion is hereby referred directly to the full Commission for consideration. The hearing officer shall add an agenda item to the CEC's business meeting scheduled for January 25, 2023, that would allow the Commission to take action on Applicant's Motion. The hearing officer shall ensure that a proposed order is submitted in advance of the business meeting.

The time to rule on Applicant's Motion is hereby extended through February 8, 2023.
