## Application for Confidential Designation for Data in Integrated Energy Policy Report Docket No. 22-IEPR-03

Dear Rebecca Meiers-De Pastino:

The California Energy Commission (CEC) has received Southern California Edison Company's (applicant) Application for Confidentiality docketed October 5, 2022, (TN 246348), covering the following data:

- Form S-1 (Capacity/Energy Requirement Form)
  - Lines 1, 7, 8, 11, 12, 16, 18, Columns H R
- Form S-2 (Capacity/Electricity Supply Resources Form)
  - Highlighted cells containing resource supply data from various sources
- Form S-5 (Bilateral Contracts Table)
  - While the applicant has stated it is seeking confidentiality for the highlighted portions of Form S-5, no cells on the spreadsheet were highlighted or otherwise indicated to be confidential.

The applicant states that such data should be designated confidential by the CEC under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) as a repeated application and that the data should be confidential for three years, until December 31, 2025, consistent with the length of time granted by the California Public Utilities Commission.

California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505(a)(4) provides: Information that has previously received confidential designation under section 2508 or section 2505(a)(3)(A) may receive confidential designation if the application contains a certification, under penalty of perjury, that the information submitted is substantially similar to the information that previously received confidential

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designation, and that the facts and circumstances of that designation remain unchanged. An application meeting these criteria will be approved.

The applicant has attested under penalty of perjury that the information contained in this application is substantially similar to information previously deemed confidential by the CEC under section 2505(a)(3)(A). Substantially similar information was deemed confidential by the CEC on November 15, 2021, in response letter TN 240600, docket No. 21-IEPR-02.

Therefore, the CEC designates the above-described information as confidential for the requested term of three years. Data may be disclosed if aggregated with data from other load-serving entities.

Be advised that under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2506, one may petition to inspect or copy records that the CEC has designated as confidential. A decision on a petition to inspect or copy records is issued by the CEC's chief counsel. Under California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2507, the executive director may disclose, or release records previously designated as confidential in certain circumstances, and the CEC may hold a hearing to determine the confidentiality of its records on its own motion or on a motion by CEC staff. The procedures and criteria for disclosing or releasing, filing, reviewing, and acting upon such petitions or motions are set forth in California Code of Regulations, title 20, sections 2506-2508.
