The California Energy Commission (CEC) and the California Air Resources Board (CARB or Board) invite you to participate in a public work group meeting to discuss the implementation of incentives for zero-emission public school buses and supporting infrastructure. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 State Budget included a total of \$150 million for incentives for the procurement of zero-emission school buses and associated infrastructure, \$135 million of which will be administered through CARB's Clean Truck and Bus Voucher Incentive Project (HVIP), and \$15 million of which will be administered through CEC's Energy Infrastructure Incentives for Zero-Emission Commercial Vehicles (EnergIIZE) Project. At this work group meeting, staff will discuss proposed changes to the school bus incentive program requirements, including incentive amounts, eligibility, and application prioritization. ## **Background**

Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Incentive Project (HVIP)

CARB's FY 2022-23 Funding Plan, approved by the Board on November 17, 2022, allocated \$135 million to HVIP for Zero-Emission Public School Buses through the Public School Bus Set-Aside. The funding is intended for public school districts for the procurement of zero-emission school buses. HVIP is the cornerstone of CARB's advanced technology heavy-duty incentives, providing funding since 2010 to support the long-term transition to zero-emission trucks and buses. HVIP offers point-of-sale discounts for zero-emission trucks and buses statewide. HVIP is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide program that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment, particularly in overburdened communities. These investments accelerate the transition to low carbon freight and passenger transportation with a priority on providing health and economic benefits to California's most disadvantaged communities. Since its inception, over 60 percent of awarded HVIP funding has benefited disadvantaged and low-income communities.

Energy Infrastructure Incentives for Zero-Emission Commercial Vehicles (EnergIIZE Commercial Vehicles or EnergIIZE)

EnergIIZE provides infrastructure incentives for public and private commercial fleets that seek to deploy battery electric or hydrogen fuel cell vehicle technology. EnergIIZE is offering incentives toward the deployment of electric charging infrastructure for electric school buses through its Public School Bus Set-Aside funding lane. This infrastructure funding seeks to benefit school districts and other entities that have been approved for electric school bus vehicle incentives through CARB's HVIP Public School Bus Set-Aside. School districts will indicate interest in and need for electric school bus charging infrastructure at the time of application to HVIP and once approved through HVIP, will work with the EnergIIZE project to supply information about their infrastructure needs.
