**Subject: Approval of SMUD's revised application to administer a community solar system pursuant to section 10-115 of the 2022 California Energy Code**

Dear Mr. Lins:

On March 3, 2023, the California Energy Commission (CEC) received an application from Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) to continue serving as the administrator of the Neighborhood SolarShares program pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Part 1, Section 10-115(c). This letter is to inform you that this revised application is approved.

The CEC previously approved SMUD's application under the 2019 Energy Code at its February 20, 2020, business meeting. Under the 2022 Energy Code, the CEC revised certain requirements in section 10-115 relating to the administration of Energy Code community solar programs. Section 10-115(c)(2) requires the administrator of an approved community solar program to submit a revised application to the CEC if there are changes in the Energy Code requirements. Any modified Energy Code requirements would not apply retroactively to the continued use of previously approved renewable energy resources developed to serve a community solar program. The Energy Code requires the CEC's Executive Director to make a determination whether to approve the revised community solar application.

CEC staff analyzed the revised application and concluded that it satisfies the requirements of 10-115(c)(2). Based on this analysis, I hereby approve SMUD's revised application.
