The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host two Tribal Listening Sessions on the Equitable Building Decarbonization Direct Install Program Guidelines open to all California Native American Tribes and related partners. Both sessions will cover the same topics.

The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted and the end time is an estimate based on the scheduled presentations and proposed topics for discussion. Sessions may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

#### Background

The State of California is committed to a just and equitable transition to carbon neutrality by 2045. Residential and commercial buildings account for about 25 percent of California's greenhouse gas emissions, so the decarbonization of buildings is essential to achieving the state's carbon neutrality goal. In September 2022, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill 209 (Committee on Budget, Chapter 251, Statutes of 2022), which directs CEC to develop and implement the Equitable Building Decarbonization Program. The program will include two components: a direct install program focused on low-income and moderate-income households, and a statewide incentive program to accelerate deployment of low-carbon building technologies. The direct install program will give preference to buildings owned or managed by California Native American tribes or tribal organizations, and buildings owned by members of California Native American tribes through a specific tribal funding component. Tribes will be able to access the general statewide program as well.

In December 2022, the CEC released a Request for Information and held an initial workshop to solicit input on key topics related to the design of the Equitable Building Decarbonization Program. Public input received at the December workshop and in written comments was used to develop the draft guidelines that can be found at the program's website: https://www.energy.ca.gov/programs-and-topics/programs/equitable-building-decarbonization-program. The proposed tribal elements of this program have yet to be developed and incorporated into the proposed guidelines. The CEC is conducting these listening sessions to better understand priorities from tribal communities on the overall program guidelines draft, as well as the forthcoming tribal specific funding guidelines.

The Equitable Building Decarbonization Program includes a preference for certain types of buildings, including those owned or managed by a California Native American tribe or a California tribal organization or owned by a member of a California Native American tribe.
