The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a public workshop to present and discuss proposed changes related to single-family building envelopes, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) buried duct requirements, and multifamily indoor air quality, envelopes, and code restructuring requirements for the 2025 update to the Building Energy Efficiency Standards (Energy Code). These proposed updates aim to further encourage the use of cost-effective and technically feasible energy efficient building practices in California.

The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the attendance instructions below. The CEC plans to begin promptly at the start time posted. The end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

Agenda

This workshop will include staff presentations on proposed updates to the California Energy Code's requirements for single-family building envelopes and HVAC buried duct requirements, and multifamily indoor air quality, envelopes, and code restructuring requirements. The workshop will also include opportunities for participants to ask questions and provide public comment.

Background

California's Building Code consists of twelve parts and is updated on a regular three-year cycle. The CEC is the state's proposing and adopting agency for Part 6 of the Title 24 Building Code (also known as the Energy Code). Staff is evaluating proposed amendments for possible inclusion in the 2025 Energy Code update.

The 2022 Energy Code, which is currently in effect, includes mandatory and prescriptive requirements for single-family and multifamily HVAC systems, indoor air quality systems, and building envelopes. The 2025 Energy Code update will improve upon the 2022 Energy Code by revising and updating energy efficiency standards for newly constructed buildings, as well as additions and alterations to existing buildings.

This is one in a series of planned pre-rulemaking workshops in preparation for the 2025 Energy Code update. The goal of these pre-rulemaking workshops is to solicit feedback from stakeholders and members of the public before the start of the formal rulemaking process. The next steps following these pre-rulemaking workshops include drafting of Express Terms for the 2025 Energy Code update, followed by a formal rulemaking proceeding and public comment period beginning in early 2024. After concluding the public process, staff anticipates publishing the 2025 Energy Code update during the first half of 2024, presenting it to the CEC and the California Building Standards Commission for adoption and approval, respectively, and setting an effective date of January 1, 2026. Based on this schedule, the proposed 2025 Energy Code update will apply to building permit applications submitted on or after January 1, 2026.
