Friends of the Inyo (FOI), on behalf of our nearly 1,000 members, submit these comments on the 2023 Land Use Screens for Electric System Planning Staff Report (Land Use Screens) and the Electric System Planning Web Mapping Application (Mapping Tool). Our comments are limited to the lands within the Inyo and Mono Counties in California. FOI is a grassroots non-profit organization based in Bishop, California. Our mission is to ensure the public lands of the Eastern Sierra exist in an intact, healthy natural state for people and wildlife through preservation, stewardship, exploration, and education. Over our 30-year history, FOI has actively engaged with land and water management agencies in the Eastern Sierra, including the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), U.S. Forest Service (FS), and State Lands Commission.

FOI supports California's co-equal goals in Senate Bill 100 and Executive Order N-82-20 (30x30). We advocate for planning California's energy future that balances the protection of our wildlife and wildlands with responsible renewable energy development. Energy planning tools such as the Land Use Screens and Mapping Tool are essential to effectively plan for energy and protect our wildlife and iconic landscapes.
