On behalf of the Imperial Valley Community Foundation, I write to express our support for the Black Rock Geothermal Project proposed in Imperial County, California.

The Imperial Valley Community Foundation (IVCF) is a 501c3 nonprofit, public-benefit organization. Our mission is to champion local philanthropy to benefit the Imperial Valley community by helping donors fulfill their philanthropic goals while preserving enduring charitable assets forever.

It is our intent to improve the quality of life of the people of Imperial Valley. Toward this end, IVCF administers different charitable funds and programs that support the community such as scholarships, corporate giving, special projects, conservation, and competitive grant programs. We actively seek to promote access, equity, and inclusiveness; and to discourage discrimination based on race, ethnicity, gender, age, socioeconomic status, and other factors which deny the essential humanity of all people.

Capital expenditures from the project are estimated to bring \$475 to \$800 million to the local economy, creating over 426 construction jobs and 61 permanent jobs to support maintenance and operation of the facility. In addition to the many jobs that will be created, the project will generate substantial tax revenue and support the local economy through direct purchase of services, supplies, and materials from local and regional companies.

We are confident and trust that the Black Rock Geothermal Project will be mindful of any cultural and/or environmental considerations, and good stewards of the land and local resources.

For these reasons, we support the Black Rock Geothermal Project. We look forward to the timely consideration and approval of the project by the California Energy Commission.
