The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a workshop to provide an update on development of the Climate Innovation Program, present potential funding topics, and gather public input on solicitation design.

The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the attendance instructions below. The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted. The end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

Agenda

This workshop will include staff presentations on the development of the CEC Climate Innovation Program, including proposed program objectives, proposed areas of investment, eligibility requirements for future funding opportunities, and selection criteria for solicitation topics. Staff will be seeking public input on these topics in anticipation of releasing funding opportunities from this program in 2024.

Background

California's Climate Innovation Program, created by Assembly Bill 209 (Statutes of 2022) and codified in Public Resources Code Section 25625¹, was created to "provide financial incentives to California-headquartered companies for developing and commercializing technologies that provide technological advancements that either help California meet its greenhouse gas reduction targets and achieve its climate goals on an accelerated timeline and at a lower cost, or enable the state to be more resilient to the impacts of climate change such as drought and wildfire."² These technologies can include, but are not limited to, "zero-emission transportation, lithium processing, manufacturing, recovery, regenerative agriculture, and drought and wildfire prevention."³ An awardee is required to repay awarded funds if, within ten years of the end of an agreement, the awardee experiences a liquidity event or leaves California.

Drawing from extensive research and initial public comments, CEC staff have drafted a set of objectives that aim to address the goals outlined in statute and provide a basis for creating solicitations. CEC is seeking public feedback in this workshop and in written comments to help determine the topics and technology areas to prioritize in the upcoming solicitations.
