Public Project Exemption to approve an Ordinance Amending Chapter 24.12 of Title 24 of the San José Municipal Code to modify provisions of the 2022 California Building Energy Efficiency Standards with certain exceptions, modifications, and additions which serve as a reach code to increase building efficiency, mandate electricand solar-readiness, and incentivize all-electric development; findings related to local modifications based upon local geographical, topographical, and climatic conditions and cost effectiveness; and authorization for the City Manager to submit the Reach Code to the California Energy Commission for its approval as required by law.

CERTIFICATION

Under the provisions of Sections 15308 of the State Guidelines for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as stated below, this action is found to be exempt from the environmental review requirements of Title 21 of the San José Municipal Code, implementing the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended.

Section 15308. Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of the Environment

Class 8 consists of actions taken by regulatory agencies, as authorized by state or local ordinance, to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of the environment where the regulatory process involves procedures for protection of the environment. Construction activities and relaxation of standards allowing environmental degradation are not included in this exemption.

ANALYSIS

The proposed action is to approve an Ordinance Amending Title 24, Chapter 24.12 of the San José Municipal Code to modify provisions of the 2022 California Building Energy Efficiency Standards with certain exceptions, modifications, and additions which serve as a reach code to increase building efficiency, mandate electric- and solar-readiness, and incentivize all-electric development; findings related to local modifications based upon local geographical, topographical, and climatic conditions and cost effectiveness; and authorization for the City Manager to submit the Reach Code to the California Energy Commission (CEC) for its approval as required by law.

The CEC updates the California Buildings Standards Code every three years. Jurisdictions may also adopt "reach codes" that require development projects to exceed the minimum Building Code requirements. Unlike the regular Building Code, a reach code must be approved by the CEC under their set guidelines.

The action proposes procedures for protection of the environment by adopting reach codes that exceed Building Code requirements by increasing building efficiency, mandating electric and solar readiness, and

incentivize all-electric development accounting for local geographical, topographical, and climatic conditions. Implementation of the Reach Code is expected to result in greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reductions and public health benefits.

Therefore, the action is categorically exempt under CEQA Guidelines Section 15308, Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of the Environment, and any subsequent actions including, but not limited to, project design, analysis, and construction activities are not exempt and would require additional environmental review.
