Notice of Availability of the *Proposed 2023 Integrated Energy Policy Report*

The proposed *2023 Integrated Energy Policy Report (2023 IEPR)* is available for public review and will be considered for adoption at the California Energy Commission (CEC) business meeting on February 14, 2024. The *2023 IEPR* was developed under the leadership of lead Commissioner Patty Monahan.

Background

Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the CEC to prepare an Integrated Energy Policy Report (IEPR) every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. The CEC uses these assessments and forecasts to develop and evaluate energy policies and programs that conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety.

Public Resources Code Section 25302(e) directs state government entities to use the information and analyses contained in the adopted IEPR to carry out their energy-related duties and responsibilities. The CEC has coordinated closely with other agencies to ensure consistency in the underlying information used to develop this report.

The 2023 IEPR lead commissioner issued a [scoping order](#), available at <https://efiling.energy.ca.gov/GetDocument.aspx?tn=249492>, on March 29, 2023, identifying topics for the report. As detailed in the scoping order, the *2023 IEPR* focuses on the following:

- Accelerating the Connection of Clean Energy Technologies to the Electric Grid
- Updating the California Energy Demand Forecast
- Analyzing the Potential Growth of Hydrogen
- Providing updates, including gas decarbonization, estimation of benefits from the transition to clean transportation systems, strategies and options for the use of gas, and implementation of energy efficiency measures.

The CEC held eleven workshops and one webinar between January and December 2023 on the topics identified in the scoping order. Information from the workshops and public comments were key inputs in developing the *2023 IEPR*. All workshop documents including agendas, background material, transcripts, presentations, and public comments, are available on the CEC's [2023 IEPR](#) webpage at <https://www.energy.ca.gov/data-reports/reports/integrated-energy-policy-report/2023-integrated-energy-policy-report/2023-iepr>.

Under the direction of the lead commissioner, the CEC will carefully review comments received on the proposed *2023 IEPR* and make changes as needed in response to comments. The proposed *2023 IEPR* will be considered for adoption at the CEC's business meeting on February 14, 2024.

Oral comments will be accepted at the business meeting. Comments may be limited to two minutes or less per speaker and one person per organization. To comment via Zoom, use the "raise hand" feature so the administrator can announce your name and unmute you. To comment via telephone, press *9 to "raise your hand" and *6 to mute/unmute.
