The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a workshop to provide information and receive public feedback on the *California Energy Commission Draft Commission Report Assembly Bill 525 Offshore Wind Strategic Plan* under Assembly Bill 525 (AB 525, Chiu, Chapter 231, Statutes of 2021) (Draft AB 525 Strategic Plan), which directs the CEC to prepare a strategic plan for offshore wind energy developments in federal waters off the California coast.

A quorum of CEC commissioners may participate, but no votes will be taken.

The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the direction provided below. Please note that the CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted and the end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

Agenda

An overview of the Draft AB 525 Strategic Plan will be presented, including the development and inclusion of input from consultant studies, workshops, consultations, meetings and other outreach and engagement. There will be multiple opportunities for general comment at the workshop.

The focus of this workshop will be on the potential impacts of offshore wind and avoidance minimization and mitigation strategies, along with ports and workforce development.

A second workshop is planned for March 29, 2024, and will be publicly noticed. The focus of the second workshop will be sea space, permitting, and transmission planning.

Background

The state legislature passed AB 525 in 2021 (https://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/faces/billTextClient.xhtml?bill_id=202120220AB525). AB 525 requires the CEC in coordination with the California Coastal Commission, the Ocean Protection Council, the State Lands Commission, the Office of Planning and Research, the Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Governor’s Office of Business and Economic Development, the California Independent System Operator, the California Public Utilities Commission, relevant federal, state, local agencies, tribal governments, and others, to develop a strategic plan for offshore wind energy developments installed off the California coast in federal waters.

AB 525 requires the CEC to provide an opportunity for public review and comment on a draft strategic plan which must include, at a minimum, the following five chapters:

1. Identification of potential suitable sea space for future lease process
2. Economic and workforce development and identification of port space and infrastructure
3. Transmission planning
4. Permitting processes and a Permitting Roadmap
5. Potential impacts on coastal resources, fisheries, Native American and Indigenous peoples, and national defense, and strategies for addressing those potential impacts

Coordination with the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM)

California has been working with BOEM since 2016 to explore potential offshore wind energy opportunities. The first meeting of the BOEM California Intergovernmental Renewable Energy Task Force (BOEM-California Task Force) was held in October 2016. In October 2018, BOEM published a Call for Information and Nominations for three areas off the California coast: Diablo Canyon Call Area, Morro Bay Call Area, and Humboldt Call Area. On October 18, 2022, the Department of the Interior announced a final sale notice by BOEM for an offshore wind energy lease sale for three

lease areas in the Morro Bay Wind Energy Area (WEA) and two in the Humboldt WEA. On December 6, 2022, BOEM initiated an offshore wind energy lease sale. The lease sale concluded on December 7, 2022, resulting in winning bids for the five lease areas from five companies.
