





- Further discussion of Pay for Performance program during HOMES Workshop on March 21





Eligibility Requirements

Community-Based Organization Definition:

A nonprofit organization, tribal entity, or governmental entity with demonstrated effectiveness representing an underresourced or tribal community and providing support and services to individuals in the community.



Program Requirements

HOMES Requirements: Modeled Savings Approach

- Regional Administrators must use DOE-approved modeling software
- Modeled energy savings must equal or exceed 20%
- CEC will measure actual energy savings for 12-month post installation period
- CEC will retain an additional 5% performance retention until actual energy savings are verified (in addition to standard 10% retention)

- Federal, state, or local agencies involved in building decarbonization

Project Tracking, Data Collection, and Reporting

- Regional Administrators to agree on single project management tool for data collection and management across all regions
- Costs for project management tool to come from administrative budgets from all regions
- Provide CEC access to program-wide dashboard updated in real time
- Collect data and produce metrics and data reports following CEC specifications

5.1 Community Focus Areas

- Recommend Initial Community Focus Areas and Justification for region

- Communicate with electric utility serving each Community Focus Area



5.2. Community Application Process

- Applying communities must meet community eligibility requirements
- Application scoring will include bonus points for communities with existing partnerships in place to allow retrofits to begin quickly

Tasks 5.4 and 5.5

5.4 Standard Packages of Measures

- Packages must be composed of required and eligible measures listed in Guidelines
- Design packages to achieve GHG reductions, bill savings, and ≥ 20% energy savings
- Identify expected GHG and energy savings from individual measures and packages of measures

5.5 Pricing and Cost Caps

 Ensure maximum average cost caps for remediation and electrical work are not exceeded





Tasks 5.6, 5.7, and 5.8

5.6 Household/Property Pre-Screening

Identify most viable households within each Community Focus Area

- Use pre-screened lists of addresses supplied by EBD screening dashboard
- Develop plan to identify and screen households in areas not covered by screening dashboard



5.7 Set-Aside for Manufactured Homes

Develop and implement approach to serve manufactured and mobile homes and allocate at least 5% of funds to these housing types

5.8 Outreach and Engagement

- Develop and customize outreach materials for each Community Focus Area
- Conduct culturally appropriate outreach to potential participants, with a focus on households identified in Task 5.6



Tasks 5.9 and 5.10

5.9 Household Eligibility and Initial Enrollment

- Develop household application template
- Develop income verification procedure in collaboration with CEC
- Conduct initial enrollment and income verification

5.10 Home Assessment

- Conduct home assessments
 - For HOMES-funded projects, assessments must meet components of ANSI/BPI standard
- Identify recommended retrofit measures
- Estimate energy savings and bill impacts
 - HOMES funded projects must achieve 20% modeled energy savings







Tasks 5.11 and 5.12

5.11 Program Participation Agreements and Tenant Protections

Agreements will identify:

- Measures to be installed, estimated savings, and bill impacts
- Rights and responsibilities of program participants, including tenant protections
- What occupants can expect during and after installation



5.12 Building Decarbonization Retrofits

- Obtain required permits and conduct retrofits
- Ensure households are enrolled in most appropriate rate plan
- Inform building owners/occupants how to use new equipment
- For HOMES-funded projects, provide a postinstallation certificate to household





Scope of Work Tasks 5.13, 5.14, and Task 6

5.13 Quality Assurance and Quality Control

Ensure successful operation of installed equipment and address participant questions and concerns

- Develop and implement QA/QC procedures
- Ensure quality of installation work for minimum of 12 months
- Maintain hotline for program participants



5.14 Participant Surveys

Survey participants about their experience and satisfaction with program

Task 6 Continuous Improvement

- Consider program data and to evaluate progress
- Propose course corrections and adjustments on regular basis





Scope of Work Tasks 7 and 8

Task 7 Coordination and Layering with Other Programs

Coordinate with other programs to leverage funding sources and reach more homes

- Develop Coordination Plan
- Minimize complexity for participants and contractors
- Use complementary funds prior to EBD funds, when possible

Task 8 Coordination with Other CEC Programs and Public Interest Research

Coordinate with other CEC-funded programs to:

- Advance public interest research
- Evaluate impact of building decarbonization technologies

- Limitations on profits and fees
- Adherence to federal cost principles and accounting standards
- Must include certain federal "flow-down" award T&Cs in agreements with subcontractors


