Thanks for taking my call on Thursday. I appreciate your time helping to review CEC staff's comments from the 6/11 PSD rulemaking workshop.

In summary of our conversation, I heard CEC staff ask for accurate data that can be used to determine a system-wide line loss factor. As we discussed, I believe it would be helpful if you could further describe the CEC's expectations of determining a system-wide line loss factor accurately. Further, I had asked if you have an anticipated timeline for docketing information in response to questions that were raised in the workshop about line losses, including the methodology used by IEPR staff to calculate the line loss factors that the PSD staff had proposed using. I understood that you could not provide a specific timeline, but aimed to docket something soon. I would appreciate if you could include a response to my request (above).
