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## **Design of the galvanized steel containers**

These containers filled with batteries should be fire safe. At least the 30 foot containers should have internal sprinklers that shower the contents at the outbreak of a fire or a high temperature. There should be city-size storage tanks of recycled water plumbed into each container with inside sprinklers 10 feet or less apart. These sprinklers would activate in the case temperatures climbed too high. It would seem that each container would have at a minimum of 3 ceiling sprinklers to contain at least fires consuming the non-Lithium materials.
