The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a meeting of the Independent Consumer Fuels Advisory Committee (ICFAC) to review and discuss the Transportation Fuels Assessment, other petroleum-focused efforts, and solicit initial thoughts from the ICFAC members. This is an in-person and remote meeting consistent with Senate Bill (SB) X1-2 (Skinner, Stats. 2023, 1st Ex. Sess., ch. 1) and Assembly Bill (AB) X2-1 (Hart, Stats. 2024, 2nd Ex. Sess., ch. 1), with both a publicly accessible physical location and public access online or by phone through Zoom. Any member of the ICFAC may participate remotely.

The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted and the end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

Agenda

CEC staff will provide an overview of the Transportation Fuels Assessment. SB X1-2 and AB X2-1 require the CEC to assess transportation fuel prices, supply conditions, and reliability in California. AB X2-1 further requires the CEC to consider the effects of refiners' inventories of fuel, feedstock,

and blending components on transportation fuel prices, and authorizes the CEC to consider ways to minimize the impacts of maintenance-related production losses on fuel prices while protecting the health and safety of workers, local communities, and the public. The ICFAC members will facilitate a roundtable discussion focused on the content presented.

Background

SB X1-2, the California Gas Price Gouging and Transparency Law, took effect June 2023 and established the ICFAC to provide expert advice and insight to the CEC and Division of Petroleum Market Oversight on petroleum fuels market instabilities in California. The CEC periodically hosts ICFAC meetings to receive advice on staff work related to transportation fuels market analysis. Through this work, the ICFAC supports the state's efforts to promote transparency, stability, and fairness in the transportation fuels market.

AB X2-1, which took effect January 2025, requires the CEC to consider the effects of refiners' inventory on the price of transportation fuels in California. The bill authorizes the CEC to develop requirements for refiners operating in the state to maintain minimum levels of inventories and to plan for resupply of lost production during planned maintenance or turnarounds. AB X2-1 builds upon SB X1-2, which aims to improve transparency into the petroleum industry and prevent consumer price spikes.

The CEC continues to engage with the members of the refining industry, labor, community advocates, environmental justice advocates and others to implement both laws. The CEC is taking a comprehensive approach to see what measures may stabilize supply and help to prevent and mitigate gas price volatility. The CEC is committed to ensuring there is a safe, reliable, affordable, and equitable supply of transportation fuels during the transition to a clean energy future.
