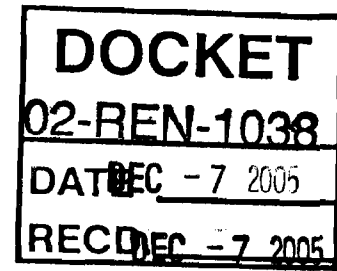

Honorable Commission Members:

Please add for your consideration the following items as it relates to the new EMERGING RENEWABLE GUIDELINES due out 1 Jan., 2006.

- 1) Parity of rebate for wind systems.  
To please increase the wind turbine rebate amount to be closer to that of solar installations. The new technologies of the 3 major manufacturer's are now harvesting substantial kilowatts in class 2 areas. The funded rebate amounts would allow more watts to go on grid to compliment solar.
- 2) Set the ceiling of the program at 30,000 watts, instead of 29,999. Cygnus Wind Systems has developed the Wind Eagle 30 just for this program. The UL listing cost was over \$60,000.00 . The C.E.C. has it listed on your web page on the certified wind turbines. We were turned down when we submitted, as it said we were over the program amount, in watts. This turbine is the most cost effective for large agricultural pumps in the program.
- 3) Maintain the present photovoltaic at \$2.80 per watt.  
The world wide demand for solar has limited the supply to the California market. The result is an increase in module pricing. This would help stabilize our market for another 6 months.
