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**NOTICE OF JOINT WORKSHOP ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE  
 ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION FUELS PLAN**

The California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) and the Air Resources Board (ARB) will jointly conduct a workshop on the development of the State Plan to Increase the Use of Alternative Transportation Fuels (the *Alternative Transportation Fuels Plan*). The *Alternative Transportation Fuels Plan* is being developed as directed by Vice Chair James Boyd and Commissioner Jeffrey Byron, the Presiding and Associate Members, respectively, of the Energy Commission's Transportation Committee, and ARB Chairman Robert Sawyer.

Staff will present the analyses done to date on the market assessment and full fuel-cycle assessment, as well as obtain public input on the key questions being investigated in this proceeding (see Attachment A). Additional workshops will be held in the course of this proceeding and the agencies will consider input and data received from persons interested in the plan development.

### **Alternative Transportation Fuels Plan Process**

Assembly Bill (AB) 1007 (Pavley, Chapter 371, Statutes of 2005) requires the Energy Commission, in partnership with ARB, to prepare a state plan no later than June 30, 2007, to increase the use of alternative transportation fuels in California. Among other things, AB 1007 requires the agencies to evaluate alternative fuels on a full fuel-cycle assessment of emissions of criteria air pollutants, air toxics, greenhouse gases, water pollutants, and other substances that are known to damage human health. In addition, the Energy Commission's Transportation Committee directed the Commission's staff to conduct a market assessment of the transportation fuels market in California in its April 28, 2006, Scoping Order for this proceeding. These two efforts will form the analytical baseline for developing the plan and policy recommendations called for by AB 1007.

### **Hearing Participation and Comments**

The agencies seek the active participation of interested parties in the *Alternative Transportation Fuels Plan* proceeding. Interested parties are encouraged to present their views either orally at the workshop or through written comments. Those submitting written comments by electronic mail should provide the comments in either Microsoft Word format or Portable Document Format, and must also submit one paper copy to the Energy Commission's Docket Unit. 





## **Attachment A**

### *State Plan to Increase the Use of Alternative Transportation Fuels*

The Transportation Committee and ARB Chair invite public comment on key issues and questions regarding the increased use of alternative transportation fuels in California.

#### ***Key Issues and Questions Regarding AB 1007 Topics:***

- What is the current and projected emissions profile for the full fuel cycle analysis of alternative transportation fuels and conventional fuels?
- What is the current and projected fuel production and distribution of alternative transportation fuels that could be used in California?
- What market share do these fuels hold currently? What is the projected market share for these fuels based on current conditions and market structures?
- What technical, economic, or regulatory challenges exist that prevent these fuels from increasing their market share and use by consumers?
- What assistance, in the form of requirements, incentives, and policies, could be used to increase alternative transportation fuels use?
- What is the potential for production and use of each alternative transportation fuel?
- What is the role of government to increase use of alternative transportation fuels in California?
- What are the economics of producing and distributing alternative transportation fuels and vehicles needed to use these fuels?
- How do the economics of alternative transportation fuels and the vehicles needed to use them compare with current and future costs for conventional fuels?
