Senate Bill 1305 (SB 1305, Sher, Chapter 796, Statutes of 1997) requires retail electricity providers to disclose specific information to their retail customers and to report detailed purchase and sales information to the California Energy Commission. The statute also requires the Energy Commission to prepare an annual report comparing the information retail providers disclose to consumers with the purchase and sales information they provide to the Energy Commission and information provided by electricity generators. The report is due to the California Public Utilities Commission by October 15 of each year pursuant to SB 1305.

This report, ***Reconciliation of Retailer Claims, 2005***, adopted by the Commission at its October 11, 2006, Business Meeting, states that 30 retail providers claimed specific purchases from 807 different generating facilities in 2005. These purchases total 194,182 gigawatt-hours. The report concludes that in 2005, retail providers claiming specific purchases have purchased sufficient amounts of renewable power to justify the claims made to their customers. This report includes an appendix that indicates the progress of retail providers in fulfilling SB 1305 Program requirements along with the renewable content of retail providers that submitted Annual Reports.
