

McKinley, if you could pose this question on my behalf to Stefan today, I'd appreciate it:

Both Mike Jackson and you stress the need to distinguish between different feedstocks for electricity and ethanol, which is a very valid point obviously. However, the TIAX reports don't always stress the difference between domestic natural gas versus LNG. This is a key point because natural gas is a feedstock for hydrogen and electricity, which impact many other fuel pathways. Do you plan to make it clear throughout your reports what type of natural gas you are considering in your fuel pathway analyses?
