

DISTRIBUTION OF SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION FACILITATING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE REVIEW OF THE SAN GABRIEL GENERATING STATION PROJECT, APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION (07-AFC-2)

On April 13, 2007, the San Gabriel Power Generation, LLC submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to construct and operate the San Gabriel Generating Station (SGGS) Project, a combined cycle electrical power plant facility, in the city of Rancho Cucamonga, San Bernardino County. A copy of this AFC was previously provided on April 20, 2007. On May 21, 2007, supplemental information to the AFC was provided to satisfy the Energy Commission's informational requirements. The Energy Commission accepted the AFC with the supplemental information as complete on May 23, 2007. The Energy Commission staff has now begun the data discovery and analysis phases of the proposed project's 12-month licensing process.

On August 17, 2007, the San Gabriel Power Generation, LLC submitted an additional supplement to the AFC describing changes made to the proposed combustion turbine generators (CTGs) and auxiliary boiler stack. The original equipment included two 180-MW (nominal) natural gas-fired CTGs. The proposed project will now include two CTGs rated at 190 MW each. The capacity of the proposed plant will have the ability to generate up to 735 MW. However, the applicant intends to limit output to 696 MW.

Energy Commission's Facility Certification Process

The Energy Commission is responsible for reviewing and ultimately approving or denying all applications to construct and operate thermal electric power plants, 50 megawatts (MW) and greater in California. The Energy Commission's facility certification process carefully examines public health and safety, environmental impacts, and engineering aspects of proposed power plants and all related facilities, such as electric transmission lines and natural gas and water pipelines. The Energy Commission is the Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), although it produces several environmental and decision documents rather than an Environmental Impact Report.

Public Participation

Over the coming months, the Energy Commission will conduct a number of public workshops and hearings to determine whether the proposed project should be approved for construction and operation and under what set of conditions. These workshops will provide the public, as well as local, state and federal agencies the opportunity to participate in reviewing the proposed project. The Energy Commission will issue notices for these workshops and hearings at least 10 days prior to the meeting.
