

California Energy Commission, we are writing to you with an urgent plea. Please hear our cries and help us in this critical matter!

We are sending this letter to you because we are <u>opposed</u> to the <u>Eastshore Energy</u> <u>Plant</u> being built in our community at Depot Road and Clawiter in <u>Hayward</u>, <u>CA</u>.

This plant will release a large volume of air pollution into our city very near to our homes, schools, hospitals and convalescent centers.

This plants pollution could increase our risks of health related problems such as asthma and cancer drastically. There are many young children and elderly people living near this site.

The effects of the air pollution from this plant combined with the already approved and larger Russell City Plant being built nearby, and the 880 and Highway 92 traffic congestion in Hayward, will put too much pollution into the immediate area. The consequences have not been studied fully. According to the California Energy Commission and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, Hayward is already a non-attainment area for pm2.5 and pm10 particulate matter. This would be our **second** power plant. According to the latest estimates, this plant would release about 64.39 tons of pm10 particulates into our air annually.

This plant uses non renewable energy resources. It is not in the best interest of the City, of Hayward, the State of California, or our world in general. See Executive Order S-3-05, By Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger.

There will be a large volume of hazardous ammonia stored at this site and transported to this site via our busy streets. Approximately 55 tons of Ammonia may escape the stacks each year, (ammonia slip), and disperse through the air over the city.

This site is too near the residential areas, buildings and schools and does not allow an adequate buffer zone between structures for **safety and security**. It is also near a well used railway track and in a seismically active area.

This plant will detract from the overall beauty and desirability of the city with 14 smokestacks 70-120 feet tall and 100 foot tall high voltage poles/towers running the length of Clawiter Road and WILL be visible from a distance. This plant will also create noise.

Hayward has already approved **one** large power plant in the near vicinity. We do not want Hayward to become a city known for its unsightly smokestacks and pollution.

We question the reason Hayward has been targeted to shoulder the environmental burden of multiple power plants. We believe this is a result of environmental disparity. Hayward is a racially and culturally diverse community. There are many low income families living here. We ask that you look into this matter on the basis of <u>Environmental Justice</u>.

This power plant is not in the best interest of Hayward as most, if not all of it's generated power may be used in other cities in the Bay Area. Hayward Residents would be forced to pay the environmental and health consequences with no direct benefit to their city.

Another matter of grave concern is the use of "Emission Reduction Credits" to mitigate pollution violations. It has been learned that at certain times this plant proposed by Tierra Energy may **exceed** the air pollution guidelines and that this will be **permitted** if the Energy Company purchases "Credits" in order to do so. We do not feel this is acceptable to fill the air of Hayward with more pollutants so near to homes and schools, especially during the already smog filled summer days when this "peaker plant" is likely to be running.

For these reasons the **Eastshore Energy Plant is <u>NOT</u>** <u>acceptable</u> to build so near to our residential areas and in our community. I (we) ask that you **not** to approve this plant at Depot and Clawiter Road in Hayward. We strongly urge you, the California Energy Commission to vote against this plant for the health and safety of the residents of the City of Hayward, California, and the residents of the Bay Area in general.
