Notice of Joint Staff Workshop On the State Alternative Fuels Plan

The California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) and the Air Resources Board (ARB) will jointly conduct a staff workshop to solicit public comments on the Committee Draft of the state alternative fuels plan to increase the use of alternative fuels in California's transportation sector. The workshop will focus on recommended actions needed to increase alternative transportation fuels, reduce petroleum use, and achieve greenhouse gas emission reductions in on-road and off-road transportation markets. Information presented and gathered at this workshop will be considered for the plan, which responds to Assembly Bill 1007 (Stats. 2005, Ch. 371). Following this workshop, the Energy Commission may consider possible adoption of the plan at its October 10, 2007, regularly scheduled business meeting.

## **Purpose**

The Energy Commission and ARB seek comments, insights, and feedback from participants on the topics, analyses, and potential actions presented at the workshop for consideration in the plan. At the workshop, actions needed to increase alternative fuel use, including government interventions such as mandates, standards, incentives, and programs will be presented. Furthermore, the full fuel cycle analyses, recommended goals, and efforts to reduce petroleum use and achieve greenhouse gas emission reductions will be summarized.

## Background

Assembly Bill 1007 requires the Energy Commission, in partnership with the ARB, to prepare a state plan to increase the use of alternative fuels in California. The Energy Commission and ARB established transportation petroleum reduction goals in 2003 stating that California should reduce on-road petroleum consumption by 15 percent below 2003 demand levels in 2020 and increase the use of alternative fuels to 20 percent of on-road transportation fuels in 2020 and 30 percent in 2030. Assembly Bill 32 (Stats. 2006, Ch. 488) directed the ARB to conduct several activities to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and the Governor's Executive Order No. S-01-07 establishes a statewide goal to reduce the carbon intensity of California's transportation fuels by at least 10 percent by 2020.
