23	Pursuant to the Notice of Prehearing Conference and Evidentiary Hearing Dates,				
24	dated October 16, 2007 ("Notice"), the City of Hayward ("City") hereby files this				
25	Prehearing Conference Statement in the proceedings for the Eastshore Energy Center				
26	("EEC" or "Project").				
27	We respond below to the specific issues raised in the Notice.				
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1	1. The topic areas that are complete and ready to proceed to evidentiary		
2	hearing.		
3	All topic areas are complete and ready to proceed to evidentiary hearings.		
4	2. The topic areas that are not complete and not yet ready to proceed to		
5	evidentiary hearing, and the reasons therefore.		
6	None to the City's knowledge.		
7	3. The topic areas that remain disputed and require adjudication, and the		
8	precise nature of the dispute for each topic.		
9	Land Use		
10	The EEC does not comply with laws, ordinances, regulations, and standards		
11	("LORS") that pertain to the safe operation of the Hayward Municipal Airport ("Airport").		
12	Because of the proximity of the EEC to the Airport and the already approved Russell City		
13	3 Energy Center ("RCEC"), pilots cannot safely navigate the airspace surrounding the		
14	Airport. Short of moving the plant, no mitigation may resolve this critical safety issue. In		
15	addition to this safety issue, siting of the EEC also significantly restricts future expansion of		
16	5 the Airport.		
17	The EEC is proposed in the City's Industrial Zone, but is not a "permitted use" in		
18	that zone and thus would require a Conditional Use Permit ("CUP"). As explained in the		
19	Final Staff Assessment ("FSA") for the project, the EEC does not meet the City's standards		
20	to obtain a CUP. The City will provide testimony to describe the aspects of the EEC that		
21	fail to meet the City's standards for a CUP. In brief, the EEC could not be granted a CUP		
22	because:		
23	• The EEC is in irreconcilable conflict with multiple provisions of the City of Hayward Airport Approach Zoning Regulations.		
24 25	• The EEC's 14, 70-foot tall stacks are incompatible with the heights of existing facilities in the area and create a visual blight to nearby residential areas.		
26	• Proposed 80- and 90-foot tall transmission lines, in addition to existing 40- and		
27	50-foot tall transmission lines create visual blight.		
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1 2 3	• The EEC is inconsistent with the City's General Plan. Pursuant to the General Plan, the City is implementing the objective of grouping the heavy industrial uses in a certain area of the industrial corridor (away from residential areas). The EEC is located outside of the heavy industrial area and adjacent to commercial and residential uses.		
4 5 6	• The EEC will emit PM ₁₀ that will substantially affect nearby residences, schools and other sensitive receptors. Mitigation through the use of reduction credits from a non-local source does not lessen the local impacts.		
7 8	• The EEC is inconsistent with the City's Hazardous Waste Management regulations.		
9	Because of this significant noncompliance with LORS, the City strongly opposes		
10	the EEC and believes there is no mitigation sufficient to avoid this noncompliance.		
11	Traffic and Transportation		
12	As will be described in testimony related to "Land Use," the EEC is incompatible		
13	with the Airport. The Federal Aviation Administration recommended that the EEC be		
14	disapproved due to safety concerns and the City will submit testimony in support of that		
15	position.		
16	Air Quality		
17	Use of emission reduction credits to offset PM_{10} emissions do not mitigate local air		
18	3 quality concerns.		
1 9	Socioeconomic Issues		
20	It is inherently unfair for the City to bear the burden of two new power plants in its		
21	City. The cumulative impact of two facilities on the City's air, water, traffic, risks from		
22	hazardous materials and the impact of simultaneous construction of two large industrial		
23	facilities are not insignificant. The City has borne its fair share of the burden to provide		
24	reliable electricity to the State by cooperating in the siting of the 600 MW RCEC power		
25	plant.


