They are problematic and have had to be replaced several times, however they were invited in, and I have the choice to not use these instruments and neither effects my families physical comfort.

Please reconsider the mandatory implementation of PCT's in future homes. Discount those that choose to install one when building if you like, but make it optional and with the ability to be over ridden. Also consider the potential "abuse factor" of mandatory PCT's overall.
