Dear Ellie,

The Hazardous Materials Division regulates businesses that use hazardous materials, dispose of hazardous wastes, have underground storage tanks, and /or generate medical waste. The primary purpose is to protect the health and safety of San Diego county citizens and emergency response personnel.

Typically for a demolition permit, a Hazardous Materials Questionnaire form may is given to the applicant to complete and obtain stamps at the bottom of the HM Questionnaire. This is how communication flows to the Building Dept. through the various Agencies on the form. I have attached the form for your review.

For a HM Questionnaire form for demolition, I would be concerned that the demolition debris is properly disposed of through a licensed hauler-particularly if the debris is considered hazardous waste. If this is a one time event (the demolition) then typically a permit is not required from the HMD. The HMD permits those businesses generating hazardous waste on a continual basis. Is this what you are referring to? Does this help you with some of your answers?
