

Orange Grove Energy Project (08-AFC-4) Supplemental Archaeological Survey Report for the Monserate to Pala Substation Transmission Line Reconductoring, San Diego County, California. October 2008. This confidential cultural resources study report consists of cover and title sheets, executive summary, table of contents, 16 pages of text, and appendices A (10 pages w/cover), B (242 pages w/cover), C (7 pages w/cover) and D (7 pages w/cover).

All of the following information considered to be confidential has been prepared by qualified consultants and has not been disclosed to any other party:

Appendix B, Information Center Records Search Results, all pages except cover page are confidential.

Appendix D, Archaeological Site Record, all pages except cover page are confidential.

The above referenced appendices should be kept confidential in perpetuity. If the descriptions of the locations of the sites are released to the public domain, there is risk of looting or other acts of vandalism to the cultural resources identified.

The above referenced appendices identify site locations and areas of potential Native American cultural significance. It is thus protected under Government Code Section 6254 (r).
