

Subject: Beacon Solar Energy Project (08-AFC-2) STATUS REPORT #5

Pursuant to the Committee Scheduling Order dated June 18, 2008, the following is staff's Status Report #5 for the proposed Beacon Solar Energy Project (Beacon).

Recent Activities and Current Issues

- Staff continues to make progress in effecting a primary objective of the Renewable Energy Action Team (REAT), as identified in the Governor's Executive Order S-14-08, – to create a more expeditious process for permitting renewable energy generation facilities under California law. Staff has received written comments and recommendations from the California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), and Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board (LRWQCB). The Energy Commission's exclusive permitting authority will subsume the CDFG and LRWQCB permits and agreements. The USFWS approval is scheduled to be issued concurrent with the Commission's licensing process.
- 2. Staff and applicant continue to make substantial progress towards resolving the outstanding issues in the areas of biology and cultural resources. Applicant has completed the field work for a geo-archeology field study which will allow staff to adequately assess potential impacts to cultural resources, and recommend appropriate mitigation measures. Regarding biological resources, staff continues to coordinate a joint environmental review with the California Department of Fish and Game, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, to develop mutually acceptable measures that will mitigate impacts to listed species.
- 3. Regarding the soils and water analysis, staff is completing its draft analysis of applicant's proposed use of potable water for wet cooling. The analysis will include a feasibility study for the potential use of non-potable water sources and/or alternative process equipment (dry cooling).
- 4. Staff continues to try and reconcile inconsistencies in the AFC data which have given rise to new issues such as engineering design criteria used for the proposed rerouted desert wash, flood plain mapping, circulation around the project, access for emergency vehicles, and engineering assumptions relied upon for the design of the proposed evaporation ponds. Staff continues to evaluate the supplemental data responses, recently submitted by applicant, in order to address these issues.

5. Aside from working to reconcile the issues described above, staff has completed the majority of the Preliminary Staff Assessment (PSA) and is finalizing the few remaining sections. Staff requires additional time for review, document formatting, and to offset reduced staffing hours resulting from the governor's furlough program. Staff is proposing to move the PSA publication date to March.
