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### Introduction

Attached are Solar Partners I, LLC, Solar Partners II, LLC, Solar Partners IV, LLC, and Solar Partners VIII, LLC (Applicant) response to the California Energy Commission (CEC) Staff's data request number 19 for the Ivanpah Solar Electric Generating System (Ivanpah SEGS) Project (07-AFC-5). The CEC Staff served these data requests on December 12, 2007, as part of the discovery process for Ivanpah SEGS. The responses are grouped by individual discipline or topic area. Within each discipline area, the responses are presented in the same order as CEC Staff presented them and are keyed to the Data Request numbers (1 through 116). New graphics or tables are numbered in reference to the Data Request number. For example, the first attachment used in response to Data Request 19 would be numbered Attachment DR19-1A.

The Applicant looks forward to working cooperatively with the CEC and BLM staff as the Ivanpah SEGS Project proceeds through the siting process. We trust that these responses address the Staff's questions and remain available to have any additional dialogue the Staff may require.

## **Biological Resources (19)**

#### **Background**

AFC Table 5.2-15 provides an overview of permits required for biological resources and indicates that the process for each requires approximately six to nine months. The AFC also refers to informal consultation with staff members at agencies regarding the project and potential biological issues of concern. However, staff could not find any documentation on the dates, personnel, and content of communications with the California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG), U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), or U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) regarding sensitive biological resources, such as the federally threatened desert tortoise, jurisdictional waters, and permitting requirements. In addition, a USFWS-approved Biological Assessment (BA) with agreed upon mitigation needs to be provided so the Preliminary and Final Staff Assessments can be completed.

#### **Data Request**

19. For jurisdictional waters, please provide expected impact acreages as well as mitigation ratios and acreages for the Clean Water Act section 401 and 404 permits and CDFG Streambed Alteration Agreement, as appropriate.

**Response:** A wetland delineation report was submitted to the USACE in February, 2008; it was revised per comments received from Shannon Pankratz and resubmitted in September, 2008 as Attachment DR19-1B. The Applicant has received a letter from USACE (Attachment DR19-1D) that states, "...we have determined that your proposed project would not discharge dredged or fill material into a water of the United States or an adjacent wetland. Therefore, the project is not subject to our jurisdiction under Section 404 or the Clean Water Act and a Section 404 permit would not be required from our office."

Reference is made to your submittal (File No. SPL-2007-00415-SLP) dated March 14, 2008, for a Department of the Army jurisdictional determination verification for waters located within the Ivanpah Solar Energy project area, located near the City of Calada, San Bernardino County, California (maps enclosed). As part of the permit evaluation process, we have made the jurisdictional determination below.

Based on the information furnished in your correspondence [CH2MHill 2007 Wetland Delineation Report; CH2MHill 2008 Revised Wetland Delineation Report; in-person meeting on December 9, 2008] and per direction by our USACE Regulatory Headquarters, we have determined that your proposed project would not discharge dredged or fill material into a water of the United States or an adjacent wetland. Therefore, the project is not subject to our jurisdiction under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and a Section 404 permit would not be required from our office.

This letter contains five approved jurisdictional determinations for the Ivanpah Solar Energy Project. If you object to this decision, you may request an administrative appeal under Corps regulations at 33 CFR Part 331. Enclosed you will find a Notification of Appeal Process (NAP) fact sheet (Appendix A) and Request for Appeal (RFA) form. If you request to appeal this decision you must submit a completed RFA form to the Corps South Pacific Division Office at the following address:

In order for an RFA to be accepted by the Corps, the Corps must determine that it is complete, that it meets the criteria for appeal under 33 C.F.R. Part 331.5, and that it has been received by the Division Office within 60 days of the date on the NAP. Should you decide to submit an RFA form, it must be received at the above address by July 28, 2009. It is not necessary to submit an RFA form to the Division office if you do not object to the decision in this letter.

This verification is valid for five years from the date of this letter, unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date. If you wish to submit new information regarding the approved jurisdictional determinations for this site, please submit this information to Shannon Pankratz at the letterhead address by July 28, 2009. The Corps will consider any new information so submitted and respond within 60 days by either revising the prior determination, if appropriate, or reissuing the prior determination. A revised or reissued jurisdictional determination can be appealed as described above.
