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Re: Site Visit and Informational Hearing for SES I (08-AFC-13)

Dear Commissioners Boyd and Byron and Hearing Officer Kramer:

We are writing on behalf of CURE (we have petitioned to intervene in this proceeding) to suggest how usefulness of the site visit can be maximized. The Application for Certification for Stirling Energy System LLC's Solar One Project indicates that the Project site lacks riparian vegetation, and that it does not contain any jurisdictional water features such as lakes, streambeds or washes. However, Google Earth imagery suggests that the Project area may contain several seasonal

lakes, or playas.² In particular, the imagery depicts several basins surrounded by what appears to be riparian vegetation.³ Views of the basins across seasons and years suggest they contain water during winter months, began to dry out in the spring, and are dry in the summer.⁴

Seasonal lakes and associated riparian vegetation are unique features that provide extremely valuable wildlife habitat in desert environments. Visual inspection of the potential playas within the Project site will provide information on their functions and values. As a result, we request that the June 22^{nd} site tour allot time for the group to visit at least a few of the features and view any surrounding vegetation. We think this can be easily accomplished.

Specifically, a cluster of three potential playas is located near the western edge of the site. It appears these playas can be accessed by walking less than a half mile from one of the existing access roads.⁵

Two other potential playas are located in the southwest corner of the site, approximately halfway between Interstate 40 and the railroad tracks. It appears that an access road bisects these playas, with one located approximately 200 feet north of the road, and the other approximately 400 feet south of the road.⁶

Potential playas 4 and 5 are located very close to the boundary of the proposed Project site. Maps in the AFC do not provide the precision necessary to conclusively determine whether these potential playas are inside or outside of the Project area. However, based on visible mineral deposits at the location where these potential playas occur, it appears they may be part of a larger playa complex that includes land both in and out of the Project area. We believe it would be

valuable for the group to visit this area to see characteristics of the site's hydrology and potential playas.

In addition to the potential playas, a couple locations within the site have what appears to be riparian vegetation. One of the potential riparian areas is located approximately 300 feet east of Hector Road, which appears to be easily accessed by tour bus. The other potential riparian area is located in the vicinity of playas #1-3, but would require walking approximately 700 feet across a large wash to access. CURE plans to have a biologist present during the tour that can provide assistance in identifying specific resources.

We think that a little time spent like this at the beginning could help address many issues that will surely arise during the course of the proceeding. It will be time well spent. Thank you for considering this matter.




Figure 3. Playa #4.




Figure 4. Playa #5.
