MARK YOUR CALENDARS - SEP GUIDELINES WORKSHOPS July 28, 29 and 31, 2009 - 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Various locations

The Energy Commission staff has scheduled three public workshops to discuss the ARRA State Energy Program preliminary guidelines and schedule for fund distribution. The workshop will focus on the three specific program areas for funding opportunities: Municipal Financing District Program (AB 811-type programs); California Comprehensive Residential Building Program; and Municipal and Commercial Building Targeted Measure Retrofit Program. Up to \$96 million will be available through a solicitation progress.

All three workshops will be broadcast over the Internet by Webex.

California has been allocated \$35.2 million for a rebate program for consumer purchases of new ENERGY STAR®-qualified home appliances. ARRA AD HOC COMMITTEE KICKS OFF

The Energy Commission ARRA Ad Hoc Committee (Chairman Karen Douglas and Commissioner Art Rosenfeld) held their first Committee workshop to discuss the ARRA energy-related funding programs administered by the Commission: Energy Efficiency Conservation Block Grant Program, State Energy Program, and the ENERGY STAR® Appliance Rebate Program. The Ad Hoc Committee has been tasked by the Commissioners to oversee the development of these programs including programs design, guidelines and application process. DOE ARRA SOLICITATIONS and ANNOUNCEMENTS UPDATE

Renewable Energy Projects: The U.S. Departments of Treasury and Energy announced a program to infuse \$3 billion into the renewable energy industry as direct payments. This new program allows taxpayers to forgo tax credits in favor of an immediate reimbursement from the Treasury Department for a portion of the property expense. The direct payments are 10% - 30% of the basis of the property and paid within 60 days of the facility being placed in service or, if later, within 60 days of receiving an application for such grant. Eligible projects must produce electricity, have land use in the U.S., and have been completed or broke ground by the end of 2010. This is not a competitive program, and there is no cap on the total grants. For more information:

Community Renewable Energy Systems: DOE announced \$21.4 million to support planning and installation of utility-scale community renewable energy projects in up to four communities nationwide. Solar Outreach for Local Governments: Solar America Cities - Technical Outreach is offering \$10.5 million to provide comprehensive outreach to local governments that will help them build sustainable solar infrastructures and expand their solar markets. Funding can be used for technical information and guidance, policies and regulations, financial incentives, training, and community interaction. Closing date to apply is October 15, 2009.
