California Unions for Reliable Energy ("CURE") submits this status report, pursuant to the Committee's May 7, 2009 Scheduling Order.

On August 24, 2009, CURE submitted a fourth set of data requests seeking information concerning the environmental baseline for an analysis of the Project's significant impacts on agriculture, impacts from heat transfer fluid spills, fire risks, and soil contamination, impacts to biological resources, mitigation for such impacts, and compliance with LORS, including the Clean Water Act and the Federal Endangered Species Act. On September 14, 2009, the Applicant submitted voluminous, sometimes inexplicable, objections to CURE's fourth set of data requests. For example, although the AFC stated that the Project will require a Section 404 permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, it refused to identify the component of the Project triggering that requirement.

On September 23, 2009, the Applicant responded to some of CURE's data requests. CURE is currently evaluating the Applicant's objections and responses and the need to petition the Committee for an order directing the Applicant to respond to CURE's fourth set of data requests.

On September 4, 2009, CURE submitted a fifth set of data requests seeking information concerning the Project's air quality, public health, and groundwater impacts, water and biomass supply requirements, mitigation for worker exposure to pesticide contamination at the Project site, among other significant impacts, and alternatives. The Applicant submitted objections on September 24, 2009 indicating that it will submit responses to some of CURE's data requests on or before

October 5, 2009. Again inexplicably, the Applicant objected to providing

information regarding nitrous oxide and methane emissions from the Project, both

of which are potent greenhouse gases; the Applicant refused to provide a discussion

of potential mitigation for the Project's significant mobile source emissions; and the

Applicant objected to all requests for information supporting the Applicant's

analysis of impacts to water resources, among others. CURE will evaluate the

objections and forthcoming responses and the need to petition the Committee for an

order directing Applicant to respond to CURE's fifth set of data requests.

On September 16, 2009, CURE served a petition to compel production of

information in response to two data requests. CURE is working as expeditiously as

possible to gather basic information regarding the Project's significant impacts.
