Workshop - Air Quality

In esponse to a request that the Applicant provide additional information on the planned use of geotextiles to stabilize the application of the Soiltac® product, URS, on behalf of the Applicant, is providing the following information:

Please keep in mind that as the engineering designs advance, additional details regarding the application of a geotextile will become available. As this happens, the Applicant will forward additional information to BLM and CEC Staff.

The recommendation was to use a geo mat about 6" deep. To go into further detail, then Soiltac® would be mixed-in to a 6" depth on top of the geo mat. It would be best to use a disc to incorporate the product in to avoid tearing up the geo mat. The disc radius would have to be less than 6", or the gauge wheels need to be adjustable in order for the discs to go to a certain depth in order not to hit the geo mat. The strength gain may not be as even using a disc to mix-in, however, by using a tiller, the geo mat would most likely be more subject to being disturbed or ripped. Strength gains will most likely be more relevant in the upper portions of the mix-in because of the way the disc method mixes soils in a side to side motion.

Additionally, geo fibers may be a better alternative, depending on Agency preference. If so and geo fibers are a better option, then fibers could be incorporated below a 6" depth. The Applicant will continue to work with CEC, BLM and other resource agencies to determine an approporiate method of soil stabilization.

The CEC also requested correspondence, or a record of conversation, with the Mojave District Air Quality Management District and the County of San Bernardino. A table showing the communications performed to date, as well as copies of email correspondence are provided behind this memorandum.


