RE: Flat-tailed horned lizard is proposed threatened as of 11/3/09.

Dear Commissioner Byron,

The Center for Biological Diversity is a national, nonprofit organization whose mission is to protect and restore endangered species and wild places through science, policy, education, advocacy, and environmental law. Many of the Center's members and on-line activists reside in the California deserts, and are familiar with the area where the SES Solar Two Project Docket Number: 08-AFC-5 is located.

Because the project site is documented habitat for the flat-tailed horned lizard, we wanted to bring to your attention the most recent court ruling on this species. On November 3, 2009, Judge Neil V. Wake of the U.S. District Court in Arizona filed an order to re-instate the flat-tailed horned lizard as a proposed threatened species, pursuant to the mandate of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, filed July 28, 2009. I have attached that order for your review.
