Subject: HYDROGEN ENERGY CALIFORNIA PROJECT (08-AFC-8) STATUS REPORT 2

Staff submits the following Status Report #2 for the proposed Hydrogen Energy California (HECA) project, pursuant to the Committee Scheduling Order dated September 28, 2009.

Current Issues and Activities for Resolution

Carbon Sequestration - Staff met with representatives from the California Department of Conservation's Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (DOGGR) on November 19, 2009 to discuss coordinated review of the project's proposal to sell carbon dioxide (CO₂) to Occidental Petroleum (Oxy) for permanent sequestration. Occidental operates numerous wells in the adjacent oil field area known as Elk Hills. DOGGR staff indicated that they do not currently believe they have statutory authority to permit oil field activities that have the goal of permanently sequestering carbon, and that such activities could conflict with their duty to ensure the continued availability of petroleum resources. The applicant believes that DOGGR has the necessary authority and, with Oxy, is taking steps to meet with the agency to try to resolve this issue. Staff is concerned that without DOGGR's involvement in permitting Oxy's sequestration of HECA's carbon emissions, there will be no mechanism to ensure the permanent sequestration of carbon produced by HECA, thus raising serious questions whether the project could comply with LORS or meet CEQA significance thresholds concerning greenhouse gas emissions. While staff is hopeful that resolution can be reached, doing so will require significant effort on the part of the applicant to coordinate with DOGGR and could result in a further delay of the schedule.

If the applicant cannot make headway on this issue in a reasonable amount of time, staff suggests that a next step forward may be to have the Committee hold a workshop or conference on this issue with the parties and DOGGR, California Air Resources Board, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and any other agencies that may have expertise/regulatory authority in the area of carbon sequestration.

Information Discovery and Analysis

Staff is working through the discovery and analysis phase of the proposed HECA project Application for Certification (AFC). Staff is currently focusing on acquiring more information in the areas of air quality, efficiency, and water resources as noted in status report 1.

Responses to Energy Commission Data Requests Set No.1 (#s 1 through 132)

On November 12, 2009, staff received Hydrogen Energy International's (applicant) data responses and is in the process of reviewing the information. In addition, pursuant to Title 20,

California Code of Regulations, Section 1716(f), the applicant has requested an extension of time (30 to 60-days) and has objected to 48 of the 132 set No. 1 data requests (e.g., air quality, visual resources, public health, soil and water resources, and cultural resources). Staff has recently received the responses to CEC Data Requests Set One (#s. 1, 2, 6, and 19), which covers air quality emissions.

Data Requests Set No. 2 (#s 133 through 141)

Staff is preparing a second set of data requests (#s 133 through 141) which covers biology, land use, public health, socioeconomics, and traffic and transportation, and at the request of the applicant will be filing this document shortly.

<u>Application For Confidential Designation – Response to Energy Commission Data</u> Requests

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 20, Sections 1209, 1209.5, 1210, and 2505, the applicant has filed with the California Energy Commission's Executive Director a request for confidential designation of responses to Energy Commission Staff's Data Requests Nos. 28, 64, 81, 82, and 115, which represent the technical areas mentioned in the previous section.

Schedule

Given the applicant's request to extend the deadline for data responses and the questions raised concerning DOGGR's involvement with the applicant's proposal to sell its carbon dioxide to Oxy for permanent sequestration, the project schedule has slipped. Once staff has received feedback from the applicant regarding any progress it has made in its efforts to resolve this issue, we will be recommending to the Siting Committee a new project schedule that better reflects the time required to work with other agencies to resolve and analyze all issues associated with sequestration.
