Staff Workshop Regarding the 2010-2011 Investment Plan for the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program

The California Energy Commission staff will conduct a workshop to present for public review and comment the draft Investment Plan [<http://www.energy.ca.gov/2010publications/CEC-600-2010-001/CEC-600-2010-001-SD-REV2.PDF>] for the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program. Commissioners may also attend and participate. This will be one of three public workshops that are scheduled to be held throughout California. San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) Regional Center Parking: The Parking Lot is limited to "Visitor" parking spaces at the "north" side of the parking lot. Purpose

Statute requires the Energy Commission to hold at least three public workshops in different regions of the state to take public comment on the draft Investment Plan. This workshop is one of three regional, public workshops that will be held throughout California. Staff will give presentations on the status of the program and provide a comprehensive overview of the draft Investment Plan and proposed funding recommendations.

Staff will invite input from the public on proposed funding allocations, project concepts, and effective incentives for proposed project concepts. The information gathered during these workshops will help staff finalize the Investment Plan.

Background

Assembly Bill 118 (Núñez, Chapter 750, Statutes of 2007), created the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program. The statute, subsequently amended by Assembly Bill 109 (Núñez, Chapter 313, Statutes of 2008), authorizes the Energy Commission to develop and deploy alternative and renewable fuels and advanced transportation technologies to help attain the state’s climate change policies. The Energy Commission has an annual program budget of approximately \$100 million to support projects that:

- Develop and improve alternative and renewable low-carbon fuels.
- Optimize alternative and renewable fuels for existing and developing engine technologies.
- Produce alternative and renewable low-carbon fuels in California.
- Decrease, on a full fuel cycle basis, the overall impact and carbon footprint of alternative and renewable fuels and increase sustainability.
- Expand fuel infrastructure, fueling stations, and equipment.
- Improve light-, medium-, and heavy-duty vehicle technologies.
- Retrofit medium- and heavy-duty on-road and non-road vehicle fleets.
- Expand infrastructure connected with existing fleets, public transit, and transportation corridors.
- Establish workforce training programs, conduct public education and promotion, and create technology centers.

The statute requires the Energy Commission to annually prepare and adopt an investment plan that determines the funding priorities and opportunities and describes how program funding will be used to complement other public and private investments, including existing state programs. All projects funded by the Energy Commission must be consistent with the priorities established in the investment plan.

On April 22, 2009, the Energy Commission adopted its first investment plan. The investment plan contains specific recommendations for expending \$176 million appropriated for the first two years of the program (fiscal years 2008-2009 and 2009-2010). This first investment plan is on-line at

The Energy Commission is also required to create an Advisory Committee to help develop each investment plan. The Advisory Committee is composed of representatives of fuel and vehicle technology consortia, labor organizations, environmental organizations, community-based justice and public health organizations, recreational boaters, consumer advocates, academic institutions, workforce training groups, and private industry. The Advisory Committee also includes representatives from various state agencies: the Natural Resources Agency; the Business, Transportation and Housing Agency; the Labor and Workforce Development Agency; and the California Environmental Protection Agency.

The first Advisory Committee meeting, led by the Energy Commission's Transportation Committee, was held on February 11, 2010, to discuss the first Staff Draft of the 2010-2011 Investment Plan and to allow the Advisory Committee members, interested stakeholders, and the public to provide input to further develop the Investment Plan.

The second Advisory Committee meeting was held on April 30, 2010, to discuss changes to the second Staff Draft of the 2010-2011 Investment Plan and provide input for the development of the Committee Plan.
